

Angus Licensing Board Publication Scheme

Produced as required by the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002

SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION TO THE PUBLICATION SCHEME

The Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA) provides individuals with a right of access to all recorded information held by Scotland's public authorities. Anyone can use this right, and information can only be withheld where FOISA expressly permits it.

Section 23 of FOISA also requires that all Scottish public authorities maintain a publication scheme. A publication scheme sets out the types of information that a public authority routinely makes available. This scheme has been approved by the Scottish Information Commissioner, who is responsible for enforcing FOISA. We are also obliged to review this scheme from time to time.

The purpose of the scheme is to provide you with details of the range of information that we routinely publish. The scheme also provides details of how you can access this information, and tells you whether it is available free, or if there is a charge for the information.

Alongside FOISA, the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (the EIRs) provide a separate right of access to the environmental information that we hold. This publication scheme also contains details of the environmental information that we routinely make available.

Where information is not published under this scheme, you can request it from us under FOISA or, in the case of environmental information, the EIRs. For further information on accessing information not covered by this scheme, refer to *Section 11 – How to access information not available under the scheme*.

SECTION 2: ABOUT ANGUS LICENSING BOARD

Angus Licensing Board administers all licensed premises with the Angus area. It deals with applications for public house, hotel and other alcoholic liquor licences as well as ancillary applications for Regular and Occasional Extensions etc under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1976. The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 will replace the 1976 Act from 1 September 2009 but transitional arrangements have been in place for new licences since 1 February 2008. Angus Licensing Board also deals with applications for premises licences and permissions under the Gambling Act 2005.

Angus Licensing Board consists of 10 members of Angus Council who are elected to the Board by Angus Council's elected members. However, Angus Licensing Board is a separate statutory body from Angus Council. The Board is supported by a Clerk who gives administrative support and professional advice. The Clerk to the Board is Angus Council's Head of Law and Administration. The Board meets at the Reid Hall, Forfar at 10am. Regular meetings take place on a designated Wednesday on a six weekly cycle as part of Angus Council's cycle of meetings. Adjourned meetings are held at the applicant's request or if there is outstanding business. Special meetings are also held as business requires or at an applicant's request.

All meetings, unless specified, are open to the public and papers are available in advance of meetings.

All administration takes place within the Licensing Section, Law and Administration Division, Corporate Services Department, Angus House, Orchardbank Business Park, Forfar DD8 1AN.

SECTION 3: PREPARING THE PUBLICATION SCHEME

When preparing or reviewing our publication scheme, we are obliged by FOISA to have due regard to the public interest in providing access to the information that we hold which relates to:

- the services we provide;
- the costs of those services;
- the standard of those services;
- the facts that inform the important decisions we take; and
- the reasoning that informs our decisions.

In preparing this publication scheme, we have tried to ensure that a wide range of information about Angus Licensing Board is made easily accessible to the public. We have undertaken a review of information requests received in order to ensure that information that is in the public interest is included in the scheme.

SECTION 4: ACCESSING INFORMATION UNDER THE SCHEME

Information available under our publication scheme will normally be available through the routes described below. *Section 12 – Classes of Information* provides more details on the information available under the scheme, along with additional guidance on how the information falling within each “class” may be accessed.

SECTION 5: INFORMATION THAT WE MAY WITHHOLD

All information covered by our publication scheme can either be accessed through our website, or will be provided promptly following our receipt of your request.

Our aim in maintaining this publication scheme is to be as open as possible. You should note, however, that there may be limited circumstances where information will be withheld from one of the classes of information listed in *Section 12 – Classes of Information*. Information will only be withheld, however, where FOISA (or, in the case of environmental information, the Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004) expressly permits it.

Information may be withheld, for example, where its disclosure would breach the law of confidentiality, harm an organisation's commercial interests, or endanger the protection of the environment. Information may also be withheld if it is another person's personal information, and its release would breach the data protection legislation.

Whenever information is withheld we will inform you of this, and will set out why that information cannot be released. Even where information is withheld it may, in many cases, be possible to provide copies with the withheld information edited out.

If you wish to complain about any information which has been withheld from you, please refer to *Section 10 – Complaints*.

SECTION 6: OUR CHARGING POLICY

All information contained within our scheme is available from us free of charge where it can be downloaded from our website or where it can be sent to you electronically by email.

We reserve the right to impose charges for providing information in paper copy or on computer disc. Charges will reflect the actual costs of reproduction and postage to the authority, as set out below.

In the event that a charge is to be levied, you will be advised of the charge and how it has been calculated. Information will not be provided to you until payment has been received.

Reproduction costs:

Where the number of copies requested exceeds 50 sides of paper or the request is for multiple copies of a single document, photocopied information will be charged at a standard rate of 10p per A4 side of paper (black and white copy) and 30p per A4 side of paper (colour copy).

Computer discs will be charged at the rate of £1.00 per CD-Rom.

Postage cost:

We may pass on postage charges to the requester at the cost to the Board of sending the information by first class post.

SECTION 7: OUR COPYRIGHT POLICY

Angus Licensing Board holds the copyright for the vast majority of information in this publication scheme. All of this information can be copied or reproduced without our formal permission, provided it is copied or reproduced accurately, is not used in a misleading context, and provided that the source of the material is identified.

The publication scheme may, however, contain information where the copyright holder is not Angus Licensing Board. In most cases the copyright holder will be obvious from the documents. In cases where the copyright is unclear, however, it is the responsibility of the person accessing the information to locate and seek the permission of the copyright holder before reproducing the material or in any other way breaching the rights of the copyright holder. Wherever possible, this scheme will indicate where we do not own the copyright on documents within *Section 12 – Classes of Information*.

SECTION 11: HOW TO ACCESS INFORMATION WHICH IS NOT AVAILABLE UNDER THIS SCHEME

If the information you are seeking is not available under this publication scheme, then you may wish to request it from us. The Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 (FOISA) provides you with a right of access to the information we hold, subject to certain exemptions. The Environmental Information (Scotland) Regulations 2004 (EIRs) separately provide a right of access to the environmental information we hold, while the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA) provides a right of access to any personal information about you that we hold. Again, these rights are subject to certain exceptions or exemptions.

Charges for information which is not available under the scheme:

The charges for information which is available under this scheme are set out under *Section 6 – Our Charging Policy*. If you submit a request to us for information which is not available under the scheme the charges will be based on the following calculations:

General information requests:

While FOISA does allow us to charge a fee for the provision of information that is not available under the terms of the Publication Scheme, Angus Licensing Board has chosen not to do so. Angus Licensing Board will therefore not levy any charge for information which costs us £600 or less to process. Information requests that cost us more than £600 to process will generally be refused.

Charges for environmental information:

We do not charge for the time to determine whether we hold the information requested, nor for the time it takes to decide whether the information can be released. Charges may be made for locating, retrieving and providing information to you.

In the event that we decide to impose a charge we will issue you with notification of the charge and how it has been calculated. The information will be provided to you on payment of the charge. If you decide not to proceed with the request there will be no charge to you.

Charges are calculated on the basis of the actual cost to Angus Licensing Board of providing the information. However, as with requests for information processed under FOISA, requests for environmental information costing us £600 or less to process, based on a maximum hourly rate of £15 will be provided without cost.

Where it would cost more than £600 to provide the information to you, however, we will ask you to pay the full cost of providing the information, with no waiver for any portion of the cost.

Requests for your own personal data:

You are entitled to request your personal data from Angus Licensing Board under the Subject Access provisions contained in Section 7 of the Data Protection Act 1998. Angus Licensing Board does not charge a fee for the processing of subject access requests.
