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What is an EP?

Educational Psychologists listen to young people. We ask how you are feeling about school or home and how things could be better.

Who will know?

If you are over 16, your parents don't have to know but it is better to involve them. It's your choice if you tell your friends.

Are you going to test me?

We will look at your school work and may use some assessments. We will ask your permission first.

How will we meet?

We can meet at school or at home, on your own or with an adult.

Are you going to write about me?

We write letters and reports to you, your parents, teachers and others involved. We will ask adults to talk to you about these reports. You can ask for changes if you want.

Do I have to see an EP?

You don't have to see us but we can offer help and support.

Is what I say kept secret?

We will ask if it is okay to share your information. If you've been harmed or are at risk, we must pass this on and will explain how this will be done.

We work with teenagers, parents and teachers, sharing ideas on learning, coping with difficulties and keeping safe.
