An election is to be held for a Member to serve in the Parliament of the United Kingdom for the said Constituency.

NOMINATION PAPERS may be delivered by the candidate, his/her proposer, seconder or election agent (where previously arranged) to the Returning Officer at:

Election Office, Angus House, Orchardbank Business Park, Forfar,

between the hours of 10.00 am and 4.00 pm on any weekday after the date of this notice, **but not later than 4.00 pm on Tuesday 20 April 2010.**

Forms of nomination may be obtained at the place and times mentioned above. The Returning Officer will, at the request of any elector, prepare for signature a nomination paper.

If the election is contested, the poll will take place between the hours of 7.00 am and 10.00 pm on **Thursday 6 May 2010.**

Postal or Proxy Voting

- Applications to vote by post for this election **MUST** reach the Electoral Registration Officer, Ravenswood, New Road, Forfar by **5.00 pm on Tuesday 20 April 2010.**
- Applications to vote by proxy for this election **MUST** reach the Electoral Registration Officer at the above address by **5.00 pm on Tuesday 27 April 2010.**
- Where a person has applied to vote by proxy at a specific election on the grounds of disability and the applicant becomes incapacitated after **5.00 pm on Tuesday 27 April 2010** the application, or an application for the appointment of a proxy made by virtue of that application, **MUST** reach the Electoral Registration Officer at the above address by **5.00 pm** on the date of the poll.
- Applications to cancel or alter postal and proxy votes, or to change from postal to proxy voting **MUST** reach the Electoral Registration Officer at the above address by **5.00 pm on Tuesday 20 April 2010.**

A person shall not be validly nominated as a candidate unless the sum of £500 is deposited by that person, or on that person's behalf, with the Returning Officer at the place and during the time for delivery of nomination papers. The deposit may be made only (a) by the deposit of legal tender or (b) by means of a banker's draft acceptable to the Returning Officer.

NOTE

- (1) The attention of candidates and electors is drawn to the rules for filling up nomination papers and other provisions relating to nomination contained in the parliamentary election rules in Schedule 1 of the Representation of the People Act 1983, as amended.
- (2) Every person guilty of a corrupt or illegal practice will, on conviction, be liable to the penalties imposed by the Representation of the People Act 1983, as amended.
- (3) All issues of postal ballot papers (except where a postal voter applies in person for a replacement for a spoilt or lost postal ballot paper) will be made by first class mail. A postal ballot paper may be returned either (a) by post or by hand to the Returning Officer or (b) by hand to a polling station in the constituency. Any person intending to vote by post, who may be unable to deal timeously with a postal ballot paper under the foregoing arrangements, should consider applying instead for appointment of a proxy.
