

## UNSUCCESSFUL or DEFERRED APPLICATIONS 2009/10

Date	Organisation	Summary	Recommendation
19 January 2010	Arbroath Community Sports Club	Grant requested towards the purchase of team football strips for this new club, formed from the amalgamation of three pre-existing junior football clubs.	<p>The aim of developing a community club should be encouraged. However, the purchase of sports kit does not fit the grant scheme themes. The club appear to have resources to pay for kit themselves, or opportunities to obtain them through sponsorship.</p> <p>Grant recommended – £0</p>
24 November 2009	Montrose & District Choral Society	Grant requested towards costs of staging two concerts.	<p>The group has sufficient bank reserves to cover the costs. The cost of their concerts is spiralling beyond their audience income. Payment for honorarium is ineligible.</p> <p>Grant recommended - £0</p>
24 November 2009	Deafblind Scotland	Grant requested towards cost of services for a newsletter, information service, activities and visits for nine people in Angus.	<p>An application from Deafblind Scotland for £1,200 was presented to the Infrastructure Services Committee on 13 October 2009 (Report 729/09). Whilst the application was recommended for rejection, the committee agreed to defer this application pending further clarification as to why this did not meet the Angus Council Community Grant Scheme criteria and information regarding possible other sources of funding. The organisation has a Service Level Agreement with Angus Council for 100 hours per month for a guide communicator service which they currently provide to 4 Angus residents. Their request to the grant scheme is for services for 9 people (including the 4 supported through the SLA) in Angus for a newsletter and information service as well</p>

			<p>as activities and visits.</p> <p>The organisation has previously applied for a grant. However each year their application is focused on services to a small number of individuals in Angus who access their services and has therefore been rejected as it is benefiting specific individuals. The Angus Council Community Grant Scheme does not support individuals. It would therefore be inconsistent to agree to this similar request.</p> <p>The Council does not have any alternative grants for individuals for which they could apply however if need for such a service was identified this would be reviewed by Social Work &amp; Health. However there may be trusts that might be able to assist and the group will be directed to information sources such as the free <a href="http://www.angus4community.com">www.angus4community.com</a> funding website to access this information.</p> <p>Grant recommended - £0</p>
13 October 2009	Deafblind Scotland	Grant requested towards provision of information services and social activities.	<p>The organisation has identified nine people who would benefit from this project.</p> <p>Funding for specific individuals is not appropriate use of grant scheme.</p> <p>Grant recommended - £0</p>

03 September 2009	Traditional Music & Song Association – Angus Branch	Grant requested towards the running costs of the Kirriemuir Festival	<p>This is a long running, much valued traditional music event.</p> <p>The group has a healthy bank balance and acknowledge in their application that the grant request is based on the possibility of future financial difficulties rather than current need.</p> <p>No grant</p>
30 April 2009	Royal Montrose Golf Club	Grant requested towards a publication on the history of the club to mark its 200 <sup>th</sup> anniversary	<p>The publication, aimed at guests of the club and other clubs has limited benefit to the wider Angus Community.</p> <p>No grant</p>
