ANGUS COUNCIL CINEMAS ACT 1985 CINEMA LICENCE

ANGUS COUNCIL in virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Cinemas Act 1985, HEREBY
LICENSES
to use the premises known as
for film exhibitions within the meaning of the said Act and that for the period from
until
(unless the licence be sooner revoked in terms of the said Act) and subject to the terms of any relevant subsidiary legislation on the following terms and conditions:-

- 1. The licensee or the responsible manager, his deputy for the time being or occupier of the premises shall immediately communicate to the firemaster of the local fire authority any outbreak of fire, however slight.
- 2. All attendants on duty to assist persons entering or leaving the auditorium shall wear a distinguishing uniform, armband or badge.
- No film shall be exhibited unless -
 - (a) it has received a 'U', 'PG', '12', '15' or '18' certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
 - (b) it is a current newsreel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
- 4. No person apparently under the age of 18 years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an '18' certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5. No person apparently under the age of 15 years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received a '15' certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 6. No person apparently under the age of 12 years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received a '12' certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 7. Notwithstanding the conditions herein before contained, a film may be exhibited or persons or any class of persons, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any condition of such permission are complied with.

- 8. A representation or written statement of the terms of any certificate given by the British Board of the Film Classification shall be shown on the screen immediately before the showing of any film to which it relates and the representation or statement shall be shown for long enough and in a form large enough for it to be read from any seat in the auditorium.
- 9. There shall be prominently exhibited at each public entrance whenever the premises are open to the public a notice indicating in tabular form and in clear bold letters and figures -
 - (a) the title of each film to be shown on that day, other than trailers and films of less than 5 minutes duration;
 - (b) the approximate times of commencement of each such film;
 - (c) whether each such film has received a 'U', 'PG', '12', '15' or '18' certificate from the British Board of Film Classification; and
 - (d) the effect of such 'U', 'PG', '12', '15' or '18' certificates in relation to the admission of persons under the age of 18 years.
- 10. The nature of any certificate received in respect of a film from the British Board of Film Classification shall be clearly indicated by the letter 'U', 'PG', '12', '15' or '18' in any advertisement of the film displayed at the premises.
- 11. No advertisement displayed at the premises of a film to be exhibited at the premises shall depict as a scene or incident in the film any scene or incident which is not included in the film as certified by the British Board of Film Classification or approved for exhibition by the licensing authority, as the case may be.
- 12. Where the licensing authority has given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises objecting to an advertisement on the ground that, if displayed, it may offend against good taste or decency or be likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling that advertisement shall not be displayed at the premises except with the consent in writing of the licensing authority.
- 13. Where the licensing authority has given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises prohibiting the exhibition of a film licence on the ground that it contains matter which, if exhibited, may offend against good taste or decency or would be likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling, that film shall not be exhibited in the premises except with the consent in writing of the licensing authority.
- 14. All exit doors shall be fitted with automatic bolts, of a pattern and in a position (to be approved by the licensing authority), the words "Push bar to open" shall be painted in four-inch white lettering on all such doors or a manufactured sign of a size and type approve by the licensing authority to be permanently fixed to the door at eye-level.
- 15. All curtains covering doors or in passages shall be hung on sliding rigs, and shall be parted in the centre, and shall not trail on the floor. Curtains shall not be used on doorways fitted with automatic bolts.
- 16. Seating provided shall be so placed that there shall be a space of 400mm (1'4") between the front of one seat and the back of the next measured between the perpendiculars, tipup seating is to be measured in the lowered position.
- 17. All passages shall be at least 1100mm (3'6") in width.

- 18. No standing shall be permitted in the Auditorium.
- 19. The licensee shall report to the licensing authority whenever substantial redecoration or the erection of scaffolding in the Auditorium is proposed.

A Certificate concerning the condition of the ceiling in terms of the Cinemas Act 1985 shall after such works, be forwarded to the licensing authority by, or on behalf of, the licensee.

- 20. Authorised officers of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service shall be entitled to inspect the premises and the fire appliances therein.
- 21. In special cases the licensing authority may add to or dispense with or modify such of these conditions as they think fit.
- 22. The licensee shall provide a log book in which any irregularities shall be noted by the aforementioned officers of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service or Police Scotland or the licensing authority and such log book shall be produced on demand by an officer of the licensing authority.
- 23. The use of inflammable film is prohibited.
- 24. No animals shall be permitted in the premises during the exhibition of a film except assistance dogs. The licensee shall not refuse admission to patrons with assistance dogs.
