CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO WINDOW CLEANERS' LICENCES

1. A window cleaner while trading must always wear the licence including photograph conspicuously on his outer garment. The licence should be made available for inspection on request by any member of the public or authorised official of the licensing authority or officer of Tayside Police Force or other body.
2. A window cleaner shall not alter, erase or deface his licence in any way or allow it to be used by anybody other than the licence holder.
3. Every window cleaner while acting as such shall be clean and tidy in his person and clothing and shall conduct himself in a civil manner and shall at all times comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974.
4. A window cleaner shall not employ or appoint for the purposes of window cleaning within the Angus area any person who does not hold a window cleaner's licence and no person under the age of 16 shall engage or be employed in window cleaning except with the prior written permission of the licensing authority. A window cleaner shall keep available for inspection a register showing the names and addresses of all window cleaners in the Angus area employed by him.
5. A window cleaner shall exhibit annually to the Licensing Authority a current personal Public Liability Insurance Certificate or alternatively show that he is covered under his employers Public Liability Insurance and also, must exhibit annually to the Licensing Authority where appropriate an Employers Liability Certificate to cover employees.
6. A window cleaner while acting as such shall comply with any order or instruction given by any constable for the prevention of obstruction or annoyance to the public or to the occupiers of any premises or in connection with any emergency or disturbance or on any occasion when such constable at his discretion may consider it necessary in the public interest to give such order or instruction.
7. A window cleaner shall notify the licensing authority of any material change of circumstances affecting him or the activity to which his licence relates. A window cleaner who ceases to act as such for the unexpired period of his licence or whose licence has been suspended by the licensing authority shall within seven days deliver his licence to the Director of Law and Administration, Angus Council, Forfar.
8. The licensing authority may, at any time, vary the term of a licence on any grounds which they consider reasonable. Notice will be given to the licence holder at least seven days before any proposed variation is considered. The licence holder will be given an opportunity to be heard before any variation is made.

9. The licensing authority may order suspension of a licence if in their opinion:
- (a) the holder is no longer a fit and proper person to be the holder of such a licence, whether because of convictions for offences which have taken place since the grant or renewal of the licence or for any other good reason:
 - (b) the activity to which the licence relates is being managed by or carried on for the benefit of a person other than the licence holder, who would have been refused the grant or renewal of a licence under para. 5 (3) of Schedule 1 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982:
 - (c) the carrying on of the activity to which the licence relates has caused, is causing or is likely to cause undue public nuisance or a threat to public order or public safety : or
 - (d) a condition of the licence has been contravened.
