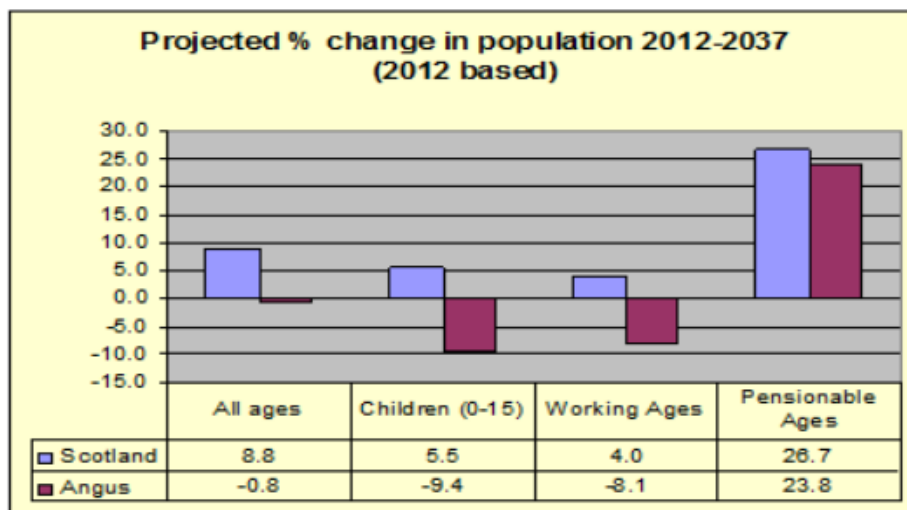

28.3% of children in Arbroath East and Lunan Ward and 7.67% of children in of Monifieth and Sidlaw Ward were living in poverty.

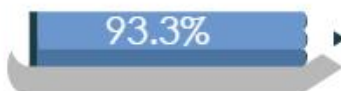

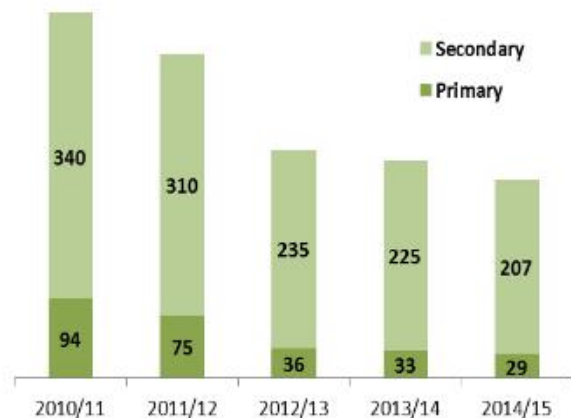

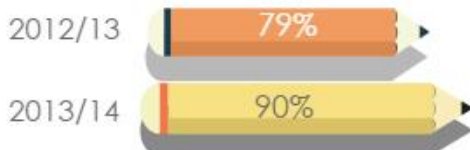

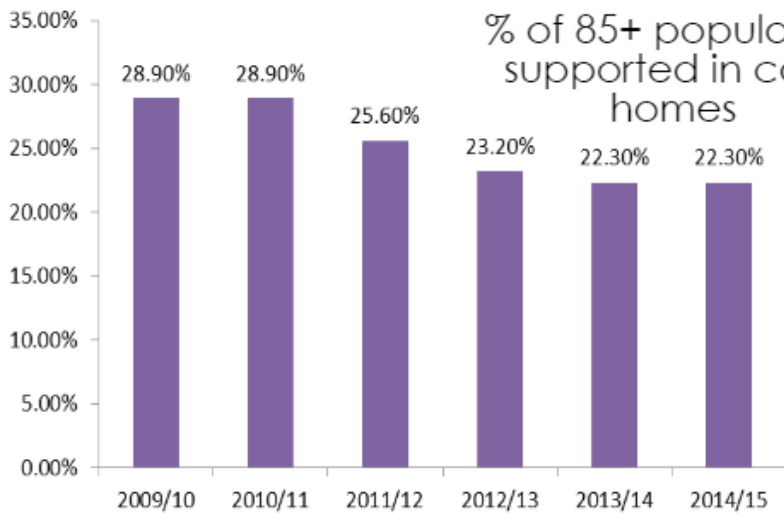
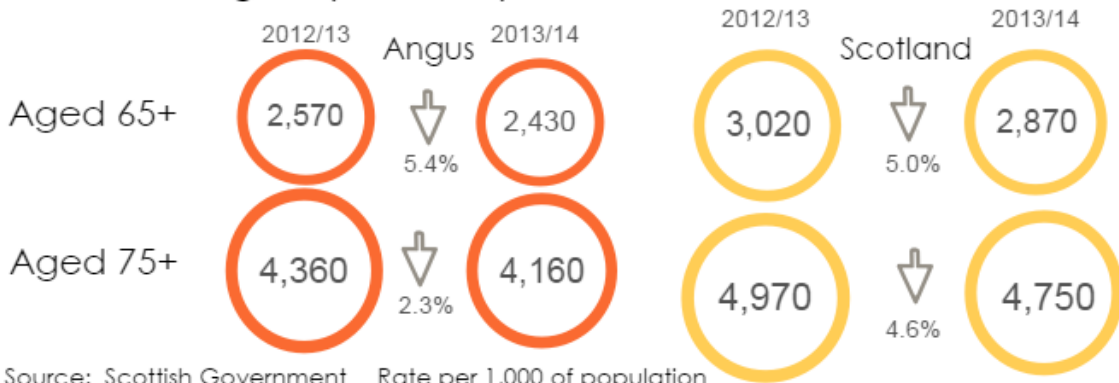

## Last 6 Months of Life Spent at Home or in a Community Setting

In 2014 **33%** of Angus adults had provided unpaid help to organisations or groups in the last 12 months  
- for Scotland as a whole, the figure was 27%.
