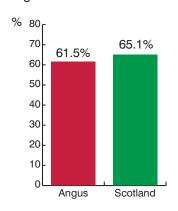

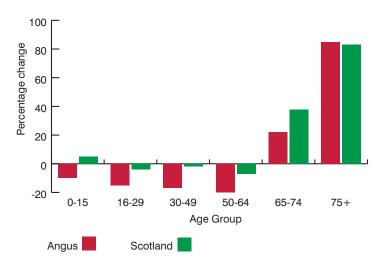
#### **Ward Map With Population**

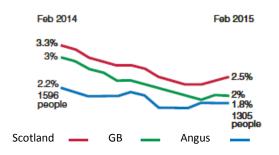
### Percentage change in population in Angus and Scotland, 2017-2037

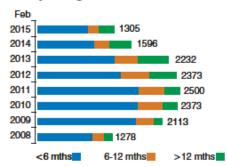

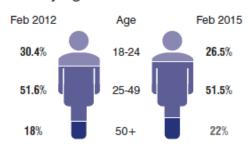

#### JSA By Length of Claim

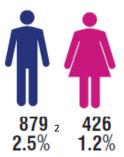

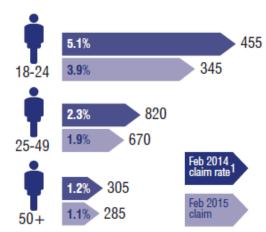

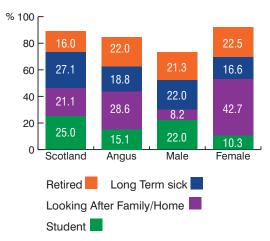

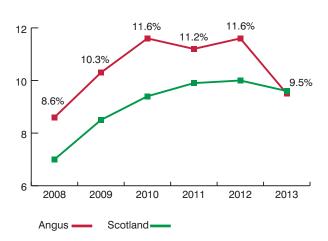

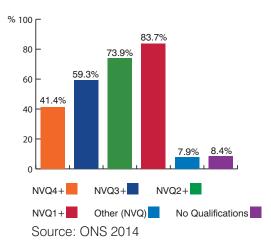

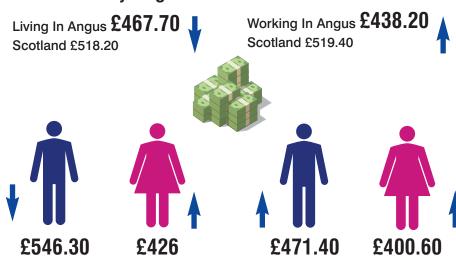
There is a slowly increasing trend of in-work poverty in Scotland.

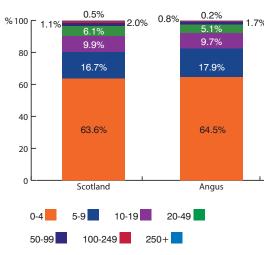

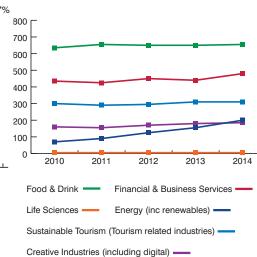

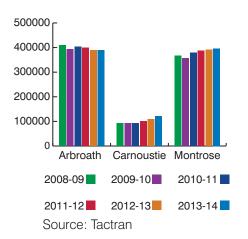

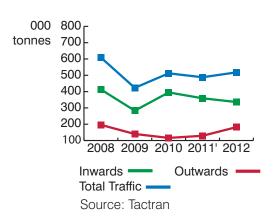
#### **Rail Station Entries and Exits**



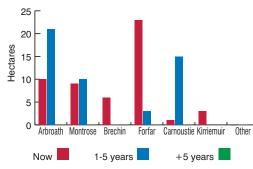

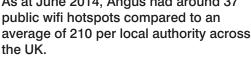


### **Employment Land Availability** By Location

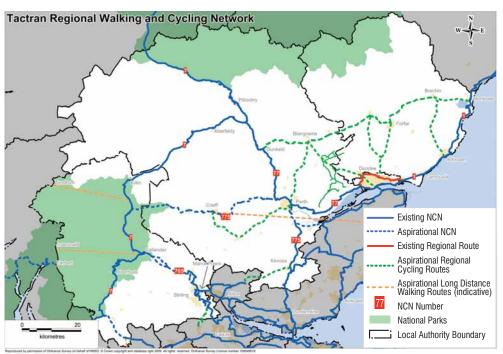

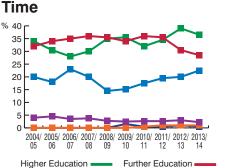
### **Destination Of School Leavers** 2013/14



#### **Initial Positive Destinations By School 2014**

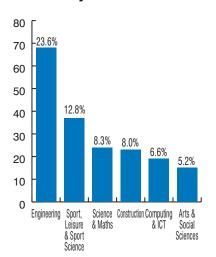

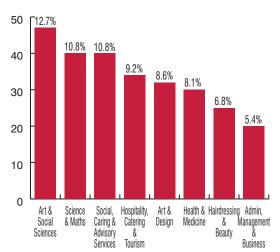

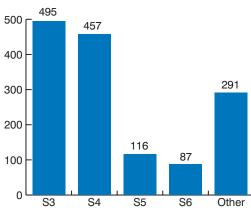
### **Top HE/FE Course Areas Male Only**

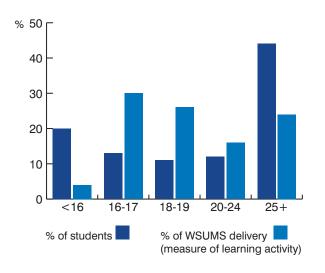

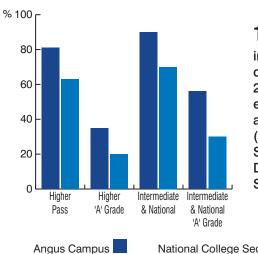

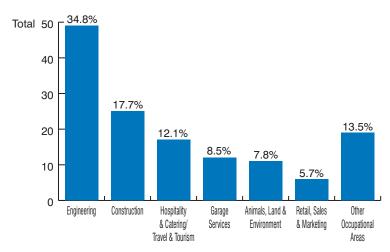
### **D&A College**

Youngest and oldest age groups tend to enrol on shorter courses. Most full-time students are 16-19.

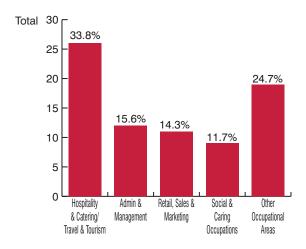
6740 students attended college in Angus in 2013/14 (78% of them from Angus), with a further 1305 Angus resident students attending at Dundee campuses.
