





Economic development sector officers have been appointed to focus on Tourism, Green Economy, Food and Drink, Business Angus, Manufacturing and Energy, and Golf. **Regional Selective assistance** (grant assistance for

companies committing to capital projects) was extended to the coastal area of Angus from June 2014.

Crowdfund Angus was launched in August 2015 to help unique and innovative ideas which may not fit other funding eligibility criteria. It won the 2016 Cosla Excellence Award for Strong and Sustainable Communities. Did you know?

The Angus LEADER rural development programme launched in 2016 to develop, promote and enhance Angus and with a budget of **£2.7million**. The **State of Angus Economy** study, profiling industry sectors, including engineering and advanced manufacturing, will inform future work in terms of job opportunities and development areas.

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








was set up in late 2015 as an employee controlled, augmented person-centred homecare service, with 26 employees and 395 service users. It now also covers support to sheltered housing across Angus, with staff levels increasing to over 50 and close to 700 service users.

The Angus Health & Transport Steering Group has developed 'Angus on the Go', a branding to promote all aspects of active travel across all Angus Communities. Did you know?

The Angus Health and Social Care Partnership took delegated responsibility for adult social care and community based health services from 1 April 2016. The partnership's vision is to place individuals and communities at the centre of service planning and delivery Participatory budgeting is a way for local people to have a direct say in how public funds are used and has been piloted in Brechin.

Thematic Priority Communities that are Sustainable A number of engagement events (eg town charrettes, locality events, children's wellbeing research) have identified issues and priorities for local communities and are being progressed with multi-agency involvement.

The 'Going the Whole Hog' project is on track to have a hedgehog 'home' (hibernacula) in every Angus primary school. In 2014, the Glengate Hall development (part of Kirriemuir Conservation Area Regeneration Scheme) won the SURF Award for Best Practice in Community Regeneration and Shelter's Scottish Empty Home Champion 'Best use of media' award.

The Glen Clova Contour Planting Project is applying good practice natural flood management techniques, aiming to reduce the rate of run off from higher ground to reduce peak water flow during flood events.

Did you know?

A post has been created to work with owners of empty homes in Angus and Dundee to bring them back into use. BeeWild Project - Voluntary Action Angus and Tayside Biodiversity Partnership, with Angus Environmental Trust funding, provided a suite of wildlife kits to improve the grounds of 9 care homes, 1 day care centre and 1 sheltered housing complex in Angus.
