ANGUS COUNCIL COMMUNITY GRANT SCHEME ANNUAL REPORT

REPORT BY CHIEF EXECUTIVE

ABSTRACT

This Report informs the Policy and Resources Committee of applications to Angus Council in 2015/16 of £1,000 or less submitted and/or approved since 15 March 2016 in 2015/16. It also provides summary information on applications submitted to the Angus Council Community Grant Scheme and feedback from applicants during 2015/16 in Appendix 1 of the report. It also seeks approval for grant requests of over £1,000 submitted since 1 April 2016.

1. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Committee:
 - (i) Note the grant awards for 2015/16 of £1,000 or less made since 15 March 2016;
 - (ii) Notes the summary information provided for applications submitted to ACCGS in 2015/16 and the feedback from applicants;
 - (iii) Approve the grants recommended for approval for over £1,000 since 1 April 2016.

 - Angus is a good place to live in, work in and visit.

3. CURRENT POSITION

3.1 The Angus Council Community Grant Scheme in its current guise has been operating since 2009 and has received or approved 523 applications. This has provided over £750,000 of support to 403 groups within the Angus community. Throughout the existence of the scheme there has been a programme of continuous improvement with regards to the processes and procedures. This has included targeting funding, improving the application process, creating a robust assessment and monitoring process and providing support to potential applicants.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Angus Council Community Grant Scheme – 2015/16

The base provision for the Angus Council Community Grant Scheme contained within the 2015/16 revenue budget totals £58,000 comprising Communities - £7,000 and Other Services revenue budget - £51,000. This base provision has been augmented by the 100% carry forward amount from 2014/15 of £9,248 being the balance of resources available from the Grant Scheme

- 5.2 Overall a budget of £67,248 was available in 2015/16.
- 5.3 The amount submitted for approval in this Report for 2015/16 totals £600. The recommended amount of £600 combined with other grant approvals in 2015/16 of £66,641.29 brings the total approved in 2015/16 to £67,241.29. This included £7,727 towards the Scottish Government Focus Year Food and Drink.
- 5.4 A repayment of £125.80 was made by Arbroath Bowling Club (1415/049) in respect of unused grant. This along with the uncommitted balance of £6.71 totals an amount of £132.51 which will be unallocated in 2015/16 and will not be carried forward to 2016/17. Due to the returned and uncommitted balance the total commitment for 2015/16 was £67,115.49.

- 5.7 The base provision for the Angus Council Community Grant Scheme contained within the 2016/17 revenue budget is £51,000. As in 2015/16, Communities have also indicated a contribution of £7,000 bringing the total amount available to £58,000. The sum of £6,210 is recommended for approval which can be met from the 2016/17 budget.
- 5.8 It is proposed to ring fence £15,000 of the £58,000 available for projects focusing on the Scottish Government Focus Year which is Innovation, Architecture and Design.
