# CHILDREN AND LEARNING COMMITTEE – 10 JANUARY 2017 ANGUS CHILDREN AND LEARNING FESTIVAL NOVEMBER 28<sup>TH</sup> and 29<sup>TH</sup> 2016

## 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 Angus Children and Learning Festival was held on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> November at Brechin Community Campus. The event showcased some of the great work and emerging practice going on across Angus to support the achievement of our children and young people. The Festival was attended by parents, teachers, social workers, youth workers, support staff, NHS Tayside colleagues and third sector representatives. The Festival explored three main themes which support the achievement of all our children and young people:
  - 1. Getting it right Pre-Birth and in the Early Years
  - 2. Getting it Right for Children and Young People
  - 3. Getting it Right into Adulthood

## 2.0 **FESTIVAL FORMAT**

The Festival programme included different components. Participants chose from a selection of keynotes, workshops and creative conversations. A Festival marketplace also provided a more informal way for Festival participants to learn about a range of services and practice.
