\$2C-001	Uplift to ANGUSalive Management Fee for additional Library Information Advisors. Information Advisors are the integrated role of ACCESS Office Assistants and Library Assistants who provide the front-line customer contact for these services. Following a period of settling in after the integration of front-line staff in November 2015, it is now clear there is insufficient resource budget provision to ensure business continuity during periods of absence and a requirement to make a minor adjustment to the rota. The established Information Advisor hours are therefore not sufficient to sustain current site opening hours and service delivery primarily as guidance to include backfill cover for these frontline employees was not available during the Service Review.		-	117	4.0	0	117	Recognised as an issue - need to provide funding for this for 2017/18 only to enable the proposed works as part of the agile working and locality hubs to progress. £30,000 of this is already provided for in the Services to Communities budget so the net uplift in the Council's budget is only £87,000

The cleaning costs have increased due to the larger footprint of both sites in comparison to the legacy facilities. The total additional cleaning cost is contingent on the result of discussions regarding the transfer of existing cleaners at Lochside Leisure Centre to Tayside Contracts and may reduce/increase based on the outcome. The synthetic pitch at Brechin Community Campus is larger than the one previously available at Brechin Leisure Centre and at Forfar Community Campus the synthetic pitch is new as there was no equivalent at Lochside Leisure Centre.
