# AMENDMENTS TO EARLY LEARNING AND CHILDCARE ENROLMENT ARRANGEMENTS REPORT BY THE STRATEGIC DIRECTOR - PEOPLE

## **ABSTRACT**

This report sets out proposals to amend the current arrangements for application and enrolment in pre-school provision.

## 1. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Children and Learning Committee:
  - (i) Approves the revised start dates for pre-school provision as set out in Part 5 of this report.
  - (ii) Approves the annual amendment of the dates in line with the school year.
  - (iii) Agree that all two year olds, eligible under the current criteria, follow the revised start dates listed below.
  - (iv) Agree that where a two year old is deemed vulnerable or is subject to a Child Protection measures, they will be admitted to settings as soon as their application is processed.

# 2. ALIGNMENT TO THE ANGUS COMMUNITY PLAN/SINGLE OUTCOME AGREEMENT/CORPORATE PLAN

- 2.1 This report contributes to the following local outcomes contained within the Angus Community Plan and Single Outcome Agreement 2013-2016:
  - Our children and young people are confident individuals, effective contributors, successful learners and responsible citizens
  - Individuals and families are involved in decisions which affect them
  - Individuals are involved in their communities

# 3. BACKGROUND

3.1 Reference is made to report number 7/15 that sets out the revised arrangements for admission to pre-school education provision. Evaluation of these procedures and evaluations on the access to placements has led to a review of the admission dates.

# 4. CURRENT POSITION

- 4.1 Angus Council currently offers four intakes per year to early learning and childcare provision for all three and four year olds. Eligible two year olds who are deemed vulnerable are admitted to settings as soon as their application is processed.
- 4.2 Angus Council will inform applicants of the success of the application within one month of the application deadline.

## 5. PROPOSALS

- 5.1 In accordance with The Children and Young People's Act (Scotland) 2014 all children are eligible to start nursery in the term after their third birthday. In order to best meet this criteria, it is proposed that the admission dates can be altered annually to ensure children born on or before the first day of each school term are enrolled to start within that term.
- In practice all children who are born on or before the first school day of a term will be eligible to start nursery on the first day of term. Admission dates will align with the start of each term. The exception to this will be the intake for August 2016 where the criterion for eligibility is already in the public domain.

These dates are subject to change on an annual basis in line with school term dates. Where a parent misses the deadline date their application will be held over till the next admission date.

# 5.3 Eligible two year olds

In order to ensure continuity, 2 year olds in a funded place will be eligible to the ongoing funding for their place from the date of their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday.
