

## **RESIDENTS CONSULTATION**

## The Occupier: Duke Street/Double Dykes, Brechin

In 2014, Angus Council carried out a comprehensive review of all the Twenty's Plenty Areas within Angus to identify any roads where speeds are at or above the recommended threshold limits for an advisory 20mph area and to further investigate the introduction of additional speed reducing features.

Duke Street, Brechin was identified, during this review, as one of eight roads within existing Twenty's Plenty Areas where the speed of vehicles was above the recommended threshold limits. Duke Street is the main access road to the new Brechin Community Campus and consideration was given at the time to the fact that the installation of physical features would affect access for construction traffic. A decision was, therefore, made to postpone the public consultation exercise, for the introduction of physical features, until after the opening of the new Community Campus.

It is now proposed that 75mm high speed cushions be introduced along Duke Street as shown overleaf. Drawings showing the exact dimensions of the proposed road humps can also be found in the Local ACCESS office. Under the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984 local authorities must consult with interested parties, including the occupiers of house frontages on affected streets, therefore your opinion is being sought on whether or not you are in agreement with the placement of speed cushions in Duke Street.

Whatever your opinion, Angus Council would be obliged if you would take the time to respond to the question below and return it to the Council by **16 December 2016** so that your views can be taken into consideration.
