### Introduction

- 1. We are the Boundary Commission for Scotland, an independent, non-political body whose purpose is to make recommendations for Scottish Parliament boundaries and UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland.
- 2. We are tasked by the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986 (as amended) to undertake a review of UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland, and we must submit to the Secretary of State for Scotland a report containing our recommendations for 53 Scottish constituencies before 1 October 2018.
- 3. This booklet contains our Initial Proposals for these constituencies, information on how to participate in our public consultation from 20 October 2016 to 11 January 2017 and details of our Public Hearings to be held throughout Scotland between 24 November and 7 December 2016.

### The 2018 Review

- 4. The review which is being conducted simultaneously by the four UK Parliamentary Boundary Commissions, will result in a UK Parliament elected from 600 constituencies in place of the current 650, and in 53 constituencies in Scotland in place of the current 59.
  - The legislation defines 2 constituencies in Scotland: Na h-Eileanan an Iar constituency and Orkney and Shetland constituency.
  - The electorate of every other constituency in Scotland must be between 71,031 and 78,507 electors, i.e. within 5% of the UK-wide electoral quota of 74,769, unless its area exceeds 12,000 square kilometres.
  - No constituency may exceed 13,000 square kilometres.
- 5. In 2011 we commenced our Sixth Review of UK Parliament Constituencies. Parliament amended the legislation governing the review in January 2013, and as a result we stopped work on the Review and did not complete it.
- 6. We commenced the current review on 24 February 2016. We are now consulting the public on our Initial Proposals. Details of how to participate in the consultation are given below. We may produce Revised Proposals during 2017, and expect to make our final recommendations for constituencies in 2018.
- 7. For each constituency, we must recommend a name and its designation as a burgh constituency or a county constituency.
- 8. For further information on the policies and procedures we have adopted to underpin this review and the legal requirements for constituency design, please refer to our Policies and Procedures booklet, which is available on our website.

### **Our Initial Proposals**

- 9. We have developed our Initial Proposals using electorate data from 1 December 2015. The number of electors registered in each council electoral ward on that date can be found on our website.
- 10. Because of the constraints on constituency design it has not been possible to construct all constituencies from complete electoral wards. Where we have had to divide a ward between constituencies we have, in most instances, followed community council boundaries or other recognisable boundaries. There are 323 whole wards and 30 wards divided between constituencies in our proposals: 40 constituencies contain 1 or more part-wards.
- 11. 35 constituencies are each contained within a single council area. The remaining 18 comprise parts of 2 council areas.

12. Our Initial Proposals are summarised in Table 1. Maps of each constituency can be found in Appendix A. The proposed constituencies and their constituent wards in each council area are listed in Appendix B.

### **Public consultation on our Initial Proposals**

- 13. The public consultation on our Initial Proposals runs from 20 October 2016 until 11 January 2017. During the consultation period we display our proposals at Display Points, where members of the public can inspect them and find out how to participate in the consultation. There is one Display Point in each proposed constituency; details are available on our website. Display materials are also available to view on our website.
- 14. You can tell us what you think of our proposals by leaving a comment on our interactive consultation portal. You can view the boundaries of our Initial Proposals and search constituencies by postcode or council area. You can compare our Initial Proposals with the existing constituency boundaries, as well as other boundaries. Maps of each constituency and further information will also be available to download. The consultation portal can be viewed here: www.bcs2018.org.uk.
- 15. As part of the consultation process, we will hold Public Hearings in Ayr, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Inverness, between 24 November 2016 and 7 December 2016. Further information can be found in Table 2.

16. The venue and start time of each Public Hearing will be published on our website.

- 17. Each Public Hearing will be chaired by a Sheriff Principal appointed by us. At each hearing, we will explain our proposals and will allow comments from anyone with an interest.
- 18. The order of business for each Public Hearing will be determined at the start of proceedings. Those who wish to make a statement at a Public Hearing are invited to contact the Secretariat to the Commission in advance of the hearing by email: bcs@scottishboundaries.gov.uk or by telephone: 0131 244 2001.
- 19. While each Public Hearing will primarily focus on a particular geographical area, comments can be made on any aspect of our Initial Proposals at any of the Public Hearings.
- 20. Transcripts of the Public Hearings will be available to view on our website and consultation portal during the secondary consultation.
- 21. We welcome all comments on our proposals, whether in support or not, to help inform our deliberations. Comments can be made in the following ways:

22. Where comments contain objections to our proposals, it would be helpful if they were accompanied by an alternative proposal that takes account of statutory requirements and considers the consequences on the wider area. In any event, comments will be weighted by the quality of argument and the evidence provided. We do not accept comments via social media.

### **Further Stages**

- 23. After the consultation period on our Initial Proposals, we will publish all comments received, and the transcripts of the Public Hearings, on our website. We will then hold a further 4 week secondary consultation period, when you will be able to submit comments to us on any of that material. All comments will be redacted prior to publication in accordance with our privacy policy.
- 24. After the secondary consultation period, we will consider all the evidence we have received. If we decide to alter our Initial Proposals, we will publish the resulting Revised Proposals for an 8 week public consultation period during 2017.
- 25. After the consultation period on our Revised Proposals, we will develop our Final Recommendations which we will submit in our report to the Secretary of State.

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries within Aberdeen City council area with one exception: ward 7 (Midstocket / Rosemount), where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary.



#### Aberdeen South burgh constituency 74,444 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries within Aberdeen City council area with one exception: ward 7 (Midstocket / Rosemount), where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary.



# Airdrie South and Shotts county constituency 73,109 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Lanarkshire council area.



#### Angus Glens and Dundee East county constituency 78,156 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Angus and Dundee City council areas with one exception: ward 6 (Arbroath West and Letham) of Angus council area, where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



#### Argyll, Bute and Lochaber county constituency 77,574 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Argyll and Bute and Highland council areas with one exception: Highland ward 12 (Caol and Mallaig), where the boundary generally follows community council area boundaries and the Caledonian Canal.



## Ayr and Carrick county constituency 77,352 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in South Ayrshire council area.



#### Banff and Buchan county constituency 76,878 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Aberdeenshire council area with two exceptions: ward 8 (Mid Formartine), where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary and ward 9 (Ellon and District) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



# Berwickshire, Roxburgh and Selkirk county constituency 74,428 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Scottish Borders council area with one exception: ward 2 (Tweeddale East), where the boundary follows community council area boundaries.



# Clackmannanshire and Stirling North county constituency 71,122 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Clackmannanshire and Stirling council areas with three exceptions, Stirling ward 5 (Stirling West), ward 6 (Stirling East) and ward 7 (Bannockburn) where the boundary generally follows community council area boundaries.



#### Clydesdale and Eskdale county constituency 75,090 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Dumfries and Galloway and South Lanarkshire council areas with two exceptions: ward 9 (Lochar) of Dumfries and Galloway council area, where the boundary follows a community council boundary and ward 4 (Clydesdale South) of South Lanarkshire council area, where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary.



# Cumbernauld, Kilsyth and Monklands East county constituency 74,961 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Lanarkshire council area.



## Cunninghame East county constituency 71,251 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in East Ayrshire and East Renfrewshire council areas with two exceptions: ward 1 (Neilston, Uplawmoor and Newton Mearns North) of East Renfrewshire council area where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and ward 6 (Irvine Valley) of East Ayrshire council area where the boundary follows a railway line.



#### Cunninghame West county constituency 74,566 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Ayrshire council area with one exception: ward 6 (Dalry and West Kilbride), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



#### Dumfries and Galloway county constituency 78,093 electors

The proposed constituency follows follows ward boundaries in Dumfries and Galloway council area with one exception: ward 9 (Lochar), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



#### Dundee burgh constituency 76,317 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Dundee City council area.



#### Dunfermline county constituency 78,254 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Fife council area.



# East Kilbride, Strathaven and Lesmahagow county constituency 76,833 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in South Lanarkshire council areas with one exception: ward 4 (Clydesdale South), where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary and the M74 motorway.



### East Lothian county constituency 76,153 electors

The proposed constituency comprises all of East Lothian council area.



#### Edinburgh East burgh constituency 74,009 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in City of Edinburgh council area with one exception: ward 15 (Southside/ Newington), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



# Edinburgh North and Leith burgh constituency 71,541 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in City of Edinburgh council area with one exception: ward 5 (Inverleith), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the rear fences of properties.



# Edinburgh Pentland and Livingston county constituency 78,164 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in City of Edinburgh and West Lothian council areas with two exceptions: City of Edinburgh ward 7 (Sighthill / Gorgie) and West Lothian ward 6 (Fauldhouse and Breich Valley), where the boundary follows community council area boundaries.



# Edinburgh South West and Central burgh constituency 77,029 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in City of Edinburgh council area with one exception: ward 15 (Southside/ Newington), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



#### Edinburgh West burgh constituency 77,738 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in City of Edinburgh council area with two exceptions: ward 5 (Inverleith) and ward 7 (Sighthill/ Gorgie) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries.



#### Falkirk county constituency 73,839 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Falkirk council area, with one exception: ward 2 (Grangemouth), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the River Carron.



#### Glasgow Central burgh constituency 75,718 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with two exceptions: ward 10 (Anderston / City) where the boundary follows the A8 road, and ward 12 (Partick West) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries.



#### Glasgow East burgh constituency 75,433 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with one exception: ward 18 (East Centre) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.


### Glasgow North burgh constituency 71,443 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with two exceptions: ward 10 (Anderston / City) where the boundary follows the A8 road, and ward 18 (East Centre) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



### Glasgow South East burgh constituency 72,479 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with two exceptions: ward 2 (Newlands / Auldburn) where the boundary follows the White Cart Water and a railway line, and ward 6 (Pollokshields) where the boundary follows a railway line.



### Glasgow South West burgh constituency 73,477 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with two exceptions: ward 2 (Newlands / Auldburn) where the boundary follows the White Cart Water and a railway line, and ward 6 (Pollokshields) where the boundary follows a railway line.



### Glasgow West burgh constituency 77,803 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Glasgow City council area with one exception: ward 12 (Partick West) where the boundary follows community council area boundaries.



# Glenrothes and Kirkcaldy burgh constituency 71,677 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Fife council area with one exception: ward 23 (Buckhaven, Methil and Wemyss Villages), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the A915 road.



### Gordon and Deeside county constituency 74,069 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Aberdeenshire council area with two exceptions: ward 8 (Mid Formartine), where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary and ward 9 (Ellon and District) where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



# Hamilton and Motherwell burgh constituency 78,281 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Lanarkshire and South Lanarkshire council areas with two exceptions: ward 4 (Clydesdale South), of South Lanarkshire council area, where the boundary follows the existing UK Parliament constituency boundary and the M74 motorway and ward 19 (Hamilton South), of South Lanarkshire council area where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



## Highland North county constituency 73,147 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Highland council area with two exceptions: ward 6 (Wester Ross, Strathpeffer and Lochalsh) and ward 13 (The Aird), where the boundary follows community council area boundaries and physical features.



### Inverclyde and Largs county constituency 73,965 electors

The proposed constituency follows ward boundaries in Inverclyde and North Ayrshire council areas with one exception: ward 6 (Dalry and West Kilbride), where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



#### Inverness and Skye county constituency 78,220 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Highland council area with three exceptions: ward 6 (Wester Ross, Strathpeffer and Lochalsh), ward 12 (Caol and Mallaig) and ward 13 (The Aird), where the boundary follows community council area boundaries and physical features.



# Kilmarnock, Cumnock and Doon Valley county constituency 78,431 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in East Ayrshire and South Ayrshire council areas with one exception: ward 6 (Irvine Valley) of East Ayrshire council area where the boundary follows a railway line.



### Kincardine and Angus East county constituency 76,784 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Aberdeenshire and Angus council areas with one exception: ward 6 (Arbroath West and Letham) of Angus council area, where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



# Kinross-shire and Cowdenbeath county constituency 75,780 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Fife and Perth and Kinross council areas.



### Linlithgow county constituency 78,026 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in West Lothian council area with one exception: ward 6 (Fauldhouse and Breich Valley), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



### Midlothian and Peebles county constituency 76,208 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Midlothian and Scottish Borders council areas with one exception: Scottish Borders ward 2 (Tweeddale East), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary.



### Milngavie and Kirkintilloch county constituency 71,594 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in East Dunbartonshire council area with two exceptions: ward 1(Milngavie) where the boundary follows the A809 road, and ward 2 (Bearsden North) where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the A81 road.



### Monklands West burgh constituency 74,263 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Lanarkshire council area.



#### Moray and Nairn county constituency 78,477 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Highland and Moray council areas.



### North East Fife county constituency 76,900 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Fife council area with one exception: ward 23 (Buckhaven, Methil and Wemyss Villages), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the A915 road.



### Paisley burgh constituency 75,331 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in East Renfrewshire and Renfrewshire council areas with one exception: ward 1 (Neilston, Uplawmoor and Newton Mearns North) of East Renfrewshire council area where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



#### Perthshire county constituency 72,831 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Perth and Kinross council area.



### Rutherglen and Hamilton West burgh constituency 76,341 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in South Lanarkshire council area with one exception: ward 19 (Hamilton South), where the boundary follows a community council boundary.



### Stirling South county constituency 71,150 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in Falkirk and Stirling council areas with four exceptions: Stirling ward 5 (Stirling West), ward 6 (Stirling East) and ward 7 (Bannockburn), where the boundary generally follows community council area boundaries, and Falkirk ward 2 (Grangemouth), where the boundary follows a community council area boundary and the River Carron.



# West Dunbartonshire and Bearsden North county constituency 77,258 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in East Dunbartonshire and West Dunbartonshire council areas with two exceptions: East Dunbartonshire ward 1 (Milngavie) where the boundary follows the A809 road, and ward 2 (Bearsden North) where the boundary follows a community council boundary and the A81 road.



### West Renfrewshire county constituency 74,958 electors

The proposed constituency boundary follows ward boundaries in North Ayrshire and Renfrewshire council areas.
