**PERSONAL LICENCE - NOTIFICATION OF CONDUCT INCONSISTENT WITH A
LICENSING OBJECTIVE**

REPORT BY THE CLERK

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this report is to advise the Board of correspondence received from the Chief Constable advising that he considers that a Personal Licence Holder has acted in a manner which is inconsistent with a licensing objective, and consider and determine what Order, if any, requires to be made in respect of that Personal Licence.

1. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board considers the correspondence received from the Chief Constable advising that he considers that a Personal Licence Holder has acted in a manner which is inconsistent with a licensing objective, and consider and determine what Order, if any, requires to be made in respect of a Personal Licence in terms of one of the following options:-

- (a) revoke the Personal Licence held by the licence holder concerned;
- (b) suspend for such period, not exceeding 6 months, as the Board considers appropriate, or
- (c) endorse the Personal Licence held by the licence holder concerned.

2. BACKGROUND

The Clerk has received correspondence from the Chief Constable advising that he considers that a Personal Licence Holder has acted in a manner which is inconsistent with a licensing objective. A copy of that correspondence shall be circulated at the meeting.

Therefore, and in accordance with Section 84A of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, the Board is required to hold a hearing. The Board may, having regard to the conduct, after giving the Personal Licence holder concerned and such other persons as they consider appropriate, an opportunity to be heard, and if satisfied that it is necessary to do so for the purposes of any of the licensing objectives, make one of the following Orders:-

- (a) revoke the Personal Licence held by the licence holder concerned;
- (b) suspend for such period, not exceeding 6 months, as the Board considers appropriate, or
- (c) endorse the Personal Licence held by the licence holder concerned.
