

Information about Secondary School Week

The secondary school week will change from August 2017. This information sheet explains what these changes mean.



From August 2017, Angus' eight secondary schools will deliver 33 learning periods of 50 minutes each week. These 33 learning periods will be spread over four longer days from Monday to Thursday and one shorter day on a Friday. The primary school week in Angus is not changing.

Here is how the new secondary school week compares with current arrangements:

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. Will the changes to the school day affect the length of the school week for young people and teachers?

Young people and teachers will spend the same amount of time in school in the new week. What has changed is how the learning time is distributed across the week.

2. My child/children use a school bus. How will the 33 period week impact on school transport arrangements?

School buses will continue to drop young people at school as normal and arrive at the end of the school day. Buses leave schools 10 minutes after the school day finishes, so at 4pm on Monday to Thursdays and 1.30pm on Fridays. No additional transport will be provided on a Friday afternoon for those young people wishing to take up optional Friday afternoon activities.

3 Will there be any changes to school lunch provision?

The school lunch break will be 10 minutes shorter and last for 50 minutes. School catering teams will continue to offer the same hot/cold lunch provision each day of the week. Lunches will be available for those who wish them on a Friday and any young people entitled to a free school meal will continue to have access to that facility. The catering team are continuing to develop 'Grab a Bag' options and a breakfast service will be established in all 8 secondary schools from August 2017. A variety of snack options will also be available at morning interval.

4. Who do I contact regarding my child/children e.g. absence, concerns?

You should continue to contact the school office (by phone or email) if you know if you know child/children will be absent from school. Each school has clear procedures for parent to school communication. Schools are increasingly communicating with parents via text and email.

If you have a particular concern you should contact your child's/ children's Pupil Care & Support Teacher via the school office.

5. What provision will be in place for my child/children on a Friday afternoon?

The school week finishes at 1.20pm on Friday and young people are free to go home after this. Buses will arrive at 1.30pm.

A programme of optional activities will be offered to Angus young people on a Friday afternoon. This programme has been put together by Active Schools Angus, ANGUSalive and Angus' Community Learning and Development team.
