3. JOINT CARE INSPECTORATE AND HEALTHCARE IMPROVEMENT SCOTLAND REPORT ON SERVICES FOR OLDER PEOPLE IN ANGUS

There was submitted Report No 124/15 by the Strategic Director – People, highlighting the publication of the Report of the Joint Inspection of Services for Older People in Angus, summarising the main findings and identifying the next steps to address the issues raised by the inspection.

The purpose of the inspection had been to find out how well the Health and Social Work Services Partnership between Angus Council and NHS Tayside delivered good personal outcomes for people who used services, and their carers; and if they could work together effectively to deliver high quality services to service users, which enabled them to be independent, and have a good sense of wellbeing; and to be well prepared for the legislative changes designed to get Health and Social Work Services to work closer together.

The summary of inspection findings were outlined in Section 4 of the Report and a copy of the final Report was attached as Appendix 2.

Having heard from the Convener, the Strategic Director – People, the Chief Social Work Officer, the Head of Adult Services and the Interim Chief Officer in relation to the inspection and in response to questions and comments from a number of members, the Committee agreed:-

- (i) to note the contents of the Joint Inspection Report;
- (ii) that action plans would be prepared as appropriate for approval by the Shadow Integration Joint Board;
- (iii) that information schedules would be submitted to the Social Work and Health Committee as the actions plans were developed and implemented; and
