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There was submitted a letter dated 14th June, 1966 from S. Scott Robinson, Town State Salioitor, Mesers. Compitell, Middliston, Burness & Dialocal stating that an anonymous client of his tirm was prepared to gift to the Council a new Steinway concert grand piano the value of which would be approximately £2,500. I thank you for your letter of 24<sup>th</sup> February, 2014 following upon our earlier telephone conversation. I was formerly a partner in the firm of Messrs. Campbell, Middleton, Burness & Dickson but that firm dissolved at the end of October, 1993. Due to the lapse of time since there are no remaining records for the former firm. S Scott Robinson was at one time Senor Partner of Campbell, Middleton, Burness & Dickson but he died a number of years ago. There are one or two former partners with the former firm who are still alive but it is unlikely that anyone will have any knowledge of the donation to Montrose Town Hall back in 1965.
