ANGUS COUNCIL COMMUNITY GRANT SCHEME

REPORT BY CHIEF EXECUTIVE

ABSTRACT

This Report informs the Policy and Resources Committee of applications to Angus Council in 2015/16 of £1,000 or less submitted and/or approved since 1 September 2015. It also seeks approval of grant applications of over £1,000 recommended for approval since 1 September 2015.

1. RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Committee:
 - (i) Note the grant awards for 2015/16 of £1,000 or less approved since 1 September 2015;
 - (ii) Note the grant awards for 2015/16 to the Food and Drink fund approved since 1 September 2015
 - (iii) Approve the grant applications of over £1,000 recommended for approval
 - (iv) Approve the proposal to move remaining budget of £7,273 from the food and drink fund back into the Community Grant Scheme.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Angus Council Community Grant Scheme - 2015/16

The base provision for the Angus Council Community Grant Scheme contained within the 2015/16 revenue budget totals £67,248 comprising Communities - £7,000 and Other Services revenue budget - £51,000. This base provision has been augmented by the 100% carry forward amount from 2014/15 of £9,248 being the balance of resources available from the Grant Scheme.

- 4.2 The amount submitted for approval in this Report for 2015/16 totals £14,054.85 (£2,940 and £11,114.85). The recommended amount of £14,054.85 combined with other grant approvals in 2015/16 of £52,276.44 which brings the total commitment in 2015/16 to £66,331.29.
- 4.3 From 1 April 2015 until 31 March 2016 or until the funding is fully subscribed there is a ring-fenced amount of £15,000 available for Food and Drink projects in support of the Scottish Government Focus Years programme as outlined in report 110/15. Since 26 May £7,727 (£1,947 and £5,780) has been awarded to projects leaving a remaining £7,273 for the remainder of the year. Due to the demand for the Community Grant Scheme it is proposed to move the remaining £7,273 back into the core budget. If not approved some of the grant applications submitted will be put on a waiting list for available funding.
- 4.4 Following the approvals in this report it would leave an uncommitted balance of £916. Those organisations and groups requiring funding for community projects will be signposted to alternative funding.
