ABSTRACT

To approve the transfer of a migrant worker site licence for Clayholes Farm, Balmachie Road, Carnoustie.

1. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee:

to approve the transfer of the site licence for Clayholes Farm, to Farmcare Trading Ltd, Clayholes Farm, Balmachie Road, Carnousite, DD7 6LA.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Application has been received from Farmcare Trading Ltd for a transfer of the licence for the Clayholes Farm, Carnosutie previously held by Co-Operative Group Ltd.
- 3.2 This is a migrant worker site with a licence for 4 holiday static caravans operating all year round. There are no changes currently proposed to the site operating times or number of caravans.
- 3.3 A recent site inspection confirmed that the site complies with licence conditions and meets the "Model Standards" under the Caravan Site and Control of Development Act, 1960.

4. DETERMINATION OF LICENCE

4.1 On the basis that the site meets the requirements of "Model Standards" in compliance with The Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act, 1960 and that the necessary planning consents are in place, a transfer of the licence can be approved. This licence will not come into force until the transfer of the ownership of the site is finalised.
