Description of Variation Sought

1. **Vary** the On Sales operating hours for Sunday from the existing commencement hours of 12.30 to 12.00.

The Board is asked to note that the hours requested are within Board policy.

2. **Seasonal Variations** - an extension to 2am for all functions and Christmas parties throughout December.

The Board is asked to note that the seasonal dates requested are outwith Board policy.

The premises currently have seasonal variations for Christmas Eve and Hogmanay.

3. Activities

(a) to include Conferences, Receptions, Club or other Group Meetings outwith core licensed hours. These activities are currently within core licensed hours only.

(b) to add Restaurant facilities within and outwith core licensing hours.

- (i) sale of food for conferences and functions 9am to 11pm.
- (ii) sale of food during and at the end of night club service with the option of sit in or take away food on Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday until 3am or 3.30am.
- (iii) quiet background music not exceeding 85dB between the hours of 2am and 3am or 3.30am dependent on what is permitted.

No alcohol will be sold after 2am.

It is requested that the Board consider the activities requested outwith hours and request that the applicant confirm that no alcohol shall be provided outwith core licensed hours.

4. **Children and Young Persons** 0 to 17 years to be permitted entry. Children currently permitted to the premises from the age of 8 years. Baby changing facilities to be provided.

Comments Received
