Angus Council 2016/17 Annual Audit Report

1. International Standard on Auditing (UK and Ireland) 260 (ISA 260) requires auditors to report specific matters arising from the audit of the financial statements to those charged with governance of a body in sufficient time to enable appropriate action. We are drawing to your attention matters for your consideration before the financial statements are approved and certified. We also present for your consideration our draft annual report on the 2016/17 audit which identifies significant findings from the financial statements audit. The section headed "Significant findings from the audit in accordance with ISA260" in the attached annual audit report sets out the issues identified. This report will be issued in final form after the financial statements have been certified.
2. Our work on the financial statements of Angus Council, Robert & William Strang Mortification and Angus Council Charitable Trust is now substantially complete. Subject to the satisfactory conclusion of any outstanding matters and receipt of a revised set of financial statements for final review, we anticipate being able to issue an unqualified auditor's report by 29 September. (The proposed report for the Council is attached at Appendix A and the proposed reports for the charitable trusts are at appendices B and C). There are no anticipated modifications to the three audit reports.
3. In presenting this report to the Scrutiny and Audit Committee we seek confirmation from those charged with governance of any instances of any actual, suspected or alleged fraud; any subsequent events that have occurred since the date of the financial statements; or material non-compliance with laws and regulations affecting the entity that should be brought to our attention.
4. We are required to report to those charged with governance all unadjusted misstatements which we have identified during the course of our audit, other than those of a trivial nature and request that these misstatements be corrected. We have no unadjusted misstatements to bring to your attention. A number of minor corrections were made to the financial statements of Angus Council and the charitable trusts.
5. As part of the completion of our audit we seek written assurances from the Proper Officer on aspects of the financial statements and judgements and estimates made. A draft letter of representation under ISA580 is attached at [Appendix D](#). This should be signed and returned by the Proper Officer (Head of Corporate Finance) with the signed financial statements prior to the independent auditor's opinion being certified.

Outstanding matters

6. There are some areas where we still require additional information and these are identified below:
7. **Outstanding queries** - we have some minor outstanding queries on some differences between the financial statements and supporting documents. We are also awaiting information to complete our sample testing of Common Good Fund transactions. These will not affect the proposed audit opinion.

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion on financial statements

I certify that I have audited the financial statements in the annual accounts of Angus Council and its group for the year ended 31 March 2017 under Part VII of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973. The financial statements comprise the group and council-only Comprehensive Income and Expenditure Statements, Movement in Reserves Statements, Balance Sheets, and Cash Flow Statements, the council-only Housing Revenue Account Income and Expenditure Statement, the Movement on the Housing Revenue Account Statement, the Council Tax Income Account, the Non-Domestic Rate Income Account, Charitable Trusts, Common Good and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as adopted by the European Union, and as interpreted and adapted by the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17 (the 2016/17 Code).

In my opinion the accompanying financial statements:

- give a true and fair view in accordance with applicable law and the 2016/17 Code of the state of affairs of the council and its group as at 31 March 2017 and of the surplus on the provision of services of the council and its group for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with IFRSs as adopted by the European Union, as interpreted and adapted by the 2016/17 Code; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, The Local Authority Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2014, and the Local Government in Scotland Act 2003.

Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing in the UK and Ireland (ISAs (UK&I)). My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of my report. I am independent of the council and its group in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to my audit of the financial statements in the UK including the Financial Reporting Council's Ethical Standards for Auditors, and I have fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion.

Angus Council Annual Accounts 2016/17

1. This representation letter is provided in connection with your audit of the financial statements of:
 - Angus Council for the year ended 31 March 2017 for the purpose of expressing an opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of Angus Council, as at 31 March 2017 and its comprehensive net expenditure for the year then ended;
 - Angus Council Charitable Trust for the period ended 31 March 2017, for the purpose of expressing an opinion as to whether the financial statements properly present the receipts and payments of the Trust for the year ended 31 March 2017 and its statement of balances as at that date;
 - Robert & William Strang Mortification for the year ended 31 March 2017, for the purpose of expressing an opinion as to whether the financial statements properly present the receipts and payments of the Trust for the year ended 31 March 2017 and its statement of balances as at that date.
2. I confirm to the best of my knowledge and belief, and having made appropriate enquiries of relevant officers and the charities' trustees, the following representations given to you in connection with your audit of Angus Council and the charitable trusts for the year ended 31 March 2017.

General

3. I acknowledge my responsibility and that of Angus Council and the charities' trustees for the financial statements. All the accounting records requested have been made available to you for the purposes of your audit. All material agreements and transactions undertaken by Angus Council and its group, Angus Council Charitable Trust and Robert & William Strang Mortification have been properly reflected in the financial statements. All other records and information have been made available to you, including minutes of all management and other meetings.
4. The information given in the council's financial statements, including the Management Commentary and Remuneration Report, present a balanced picture of Angus Council and is consistent with the financial statements. I confirm that the effects of uncorrected misstatements are immaterial, individually and in aggregate, to the financial statements as a whole. I am not aware of any uncorrected misstatements other than those identified in the auditor's report to those charged with governance (ISA 260).

5. I confirm that Angus Council Charitable Trust and Robert & William Strang Mortification are the only trusts where the sole trustee is Angus Council that require an audit as at 31 March 2017. The information given in the financial statements, including the Trustees' Annual Reports, presents a balanced picture of the trusts and is consistent with the financial statements. I am not aware of any uncorrected misstatements other than those identified in the auditor's report to those charged with governance (ISA 260).

Financial Reporting Framework

6. The council's financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17, and in accordance with the requirements of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, the Local Authority Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2014 and the Local Government in Scotland Act 2003.
7. The charitable trusts' financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and the provisions of the charities' constitutions.
8. Disclosure has been made in the financial statements of all matters necessary for them to show a true and fair view of the transactions and state of affairs of Angus Council and its group, Angus Council Charitable Trust and Robert & William Strang Mortification for the year ended 31 March 2017.

Accounting Policies & Estimates

9. All material accounting policies adopted are as shown in the Statement of Accounting Policies included in the financial statements. The continuing appropriateness of these policies has been reviewed since the introduction of IAS 8 and on a regular basis thereafter, and takes account of the requirements set out in the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17.
10. The significant assumptions used in making accounting estimates are reasonable and properly reflected in the financial statements. There are no changes in estimation techniques which should be disclosed due to their having a material impact on the accounting disclosures.

Going Concern

11. I have assessed Angus Council's ability to carry on as a going concern and have concluded that it is appropriate to adopt a going concern basis for the preparation of the financial statements.

Related Party Transactions

12. All transactions with related parties have been disclosed in the financial statements. I have made available to you all the relevant information concerning such transactions, and I am not aware of any other matters that require disclosure in order to comply with the requirements of IAS24, as interpreted by the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17.

Events Subsequent to the Date of the Balance Sheet

13. There have been no material changes in the value of investments since the date of the Balance Sheet which necessitate revision of the figures in the financial statements or notes thereto including contingent assets and liabilities.
14. Since the date of the Balance Sheet no events or transactions have occurred which, though properly excluded from the financial statements, are of such importance that they should be brought to your notice.

Corporate Governance

15. I acknowledge as the officer with responsibility for the proper administration of the Council's financial affairs under section 95 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, my responsibility for the corporate governance arrangements. I confirm that I have disclosed to the auditor all deficiencies in internal control of which I am aware.
16. The corporate governance arrangements have been reviewed and the disclosures I have made are in accordance with the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17. There have been no changes in the corporate governance arrangements or issues identified, since the 31 March 2017, which require disclosure.

Fraud

17. I have considered the risk that the financial statements may be materially misstated as a result of fraud. I have disclosed to the auditor any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the financial statements. There have been no irregularities involving management or employees who have a significant role in internal control or that could have a material effect on the financial statements.

Assets

18. The assets shown in the council Balance Sheet and the charitable trusts' statement of balances at 31 March 2016 were owned by Angus Council, other than assets which have been purchased under finance leases, and the charitable trusts. Assets are free from any lien, encumbrance or charge except as disclosed in the financial statements.

Liabilities

19. All liabilities have been provided for in the financial records, including the liabilities for all purchases to which title has passed prior to 31 March 2017.

Carrying Value of Assets and Liabilities

20. The assets and liabilities have been recognised, measured, presented and disclosed in accordance with the Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2016/17. There are no plans or intentions that are likely to affect the carrying value of classification of the assets and liabilities within the financial statements.

Provisions

21. Provisions have been made in the financial statements for all material liabilities which have resulted or may be expected to result, by legal action or otherwise, from events which had

occurred by 31 March 2017 and of which Angus Council could reasonably be expected to be aware. The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the expenditure likely to be required to settle the present obligation at 31 March 2017.

Integration Joint Boards

22. Angus Integration Joint Board has been consolidated within the Angus Council financial statements for 2016/17 in accordance with IAS 27 Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements and the health board accounts manual 2016/17. The Integration Joint Board figures used in the consolidation process were based on the unaudited accounts for Angus Integration Joint Board. The Angus Integration Joint Board accounts are now audited and there are no changes to the draft figures used in the consolidation.
