4. FINAL BUSINESS CASE FOR THE RESIDUAL WASTE MANAGEMENT PROCUREMENT PROJECT BETWEEN DUNDEE CITY COUNCIL AND ANGUS COUNCIL

With reference to Article 18 of the minute of meeting of Angus Council of 23 March 2017, there was submitted Report No 336/17 by the Strategic Director – Place, which reviewed the Final Business Case Development Partnership with Dundee City Council to secure the long term disposal of residual waste to meet The Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012 and also proposing that Angus Council enter into a partnership for the long term disposal of residual waste to ensure compliance with The Waste (Scotland) Regulations 2012.
