## 1. APOLOGIES

## 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

## 3. NEW CONTROL MEASURES AT RECYCLING CENTRES

With reference to Article 12 of the minute of meeting of Angus Council of 19 October 2017, there was re-submitted Report No 357/17 by the Head of Housing, Regulatory and Protective Services, regarding proposals for new control measures at Recycling Centres to address identified health and safety issues.

It was noted that officer advice had now been received and on that basis it was proposed that trailers in excess of six feet bed length be prohibited from Recycling Centres in Brechin, Carnoustie, Forfar and Monifieth.

The Council resolved to implement the banning of trailers in excess of six feet bed length from Brechin, Carnoustie, Forfar and Monifieth Recycling Centres.
