With reference above, Monifieth Community Council discussed this matter at our meeting on 13th December and have come to the conclusion there should be 7 localities, one for each Burgh.

This is due to the widely differing spreads of population throughout Angus with the Burghs accounting for the majority of the population in tightly concentrated areas, while the remaining rural area with smaller concentrations cannot be treated in the same manner due to their different needs and requirements.
