## Summary of representations received and responses issued

Issue raised	Summary of response
Length of time that areas will be closed (9 representations).	Clarified the phasing of the closures and availability of alternative routes. Emphasised the necessity of the closures to ensure public safety during construction and de-rig. Advised that whilst the Order will enable the organisers to restrict access as and when required, within the areas and timeframes specified, the size and timing of closed areas will be kept to an absolute minimum.
Access to the beach (7 representations).	Explained that an early error in the maps had been rectified. Clarified that access to the beach will be available throughout the beach via steps at the seafront play park and the ramp to the east.
Effect on National Cycle Route 1, and specifically the diversion onto A92 cycle route during the event week (3 representations, including Sustrans).	The diversion on to A92 cycle route is considered to be least disruptive to through cyclists during the event week. The coastal cycle path will remain available for pedestrian/cycle access to Carnoustie and to the event. (Sustrans have confirmed that they are happy with this).
General principle of closures (2 representations).	Explained the necessity of the closures for safety reasons. Explained that the closure periods were being kept as short as possible and that alternative routes would be available for much of the time.
Disruption to residents (1 representation).	Clarified that a residents' information leaflet would be distributed in due course.
Timing of the consultation over the Christmas/New Year period (1 representation).	Advised that the consultation period had been extended by 1 week to take this into account.
Restrictions to boat launching (1 representation – Carnoustie Sailing Club).	Advised that launching access would be available subject to health and safety considerations, other than during the event week.
Supportive of the proposed Order (1 representation – Angus Local Access Forum).	No response required.
