

**ANGUS HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE****INTEGRATION JOINT BOARD AUDIT COMMITTEE – 29 AUGUST 2018****EXTERNAL REPORTS****REPORT BY ALEXANDER BERRY, CHIEF FINANCE OFFICER****ABSTRACT**
