DAMACRE ROAD, BRECHIN - ONE-WAY TRAFFIC

REPORT BY HEAD OF INFRASTRUCTURE

ABSTRACT

This report presents the results of the public consultation process on proposals for the introduction of a one-way traffic management system in Damacre Road, Brechin.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Committee:

- (i) notes the comments received during the consultation process;
- (ii) notes the range of opinions expressed by those who have responded to the consultation; and
- (iii) agrees not to proceed with the installation of a one-way system in Damacre Road, Brechin on the basis of the consultation responses.

2. ALIGNMENT TO THE ANGUS LOCAL OUTCOMES IMPROVEMENT PLAN/CORPORATE PLAN

This proposal contributes to the following local outcomes contained within the Angus Local Outcomes Improvement Plan and Locality Plans:

- Safe, secure, vibrant and sustainable communities.
- An enhanced, protected and enjoyed natural and built environment.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Report 293/18 considered by the Communities Committee on 25 September 2018, detailed the format and timescale for public consultation regarding the proposal to install a one-way system on Damacre Road in Brechin. The proposal is represented on the plan appended to the report (see **Appendix 1**)
- 3.2 The consultation documents associated with this proposal were issued to approximately 68 residential and business addresses within the surrounding area of the proposed installation (see **Appendix 2**). Consultation documents were also sent to all affected groups listed in **Appendix 3** and were made available at Brechin Access Office for the general public to comment on the proposal. The consultation questionnaire was also available for completion online via the Council's website.
- 3.3 21 completed responses were received from individuals by the closing date of 9 November 2018. Of these responses 8 agreed with the proposal to introduce a one-way system and 13 disagreed with the proposal. The comments which were provided along with the returned consultation documents are shown in **Appendix 4.**

- 3.4 Whilst the number of responses to the consultation was relatively modest, the majority of returned consultation documents expressed a desire for the proposed one-way system in Damacre Road not to proceed.
- 3.5 Following completion of the consultation exercise on 9 November 2018, a further 3 documents were re-issued to business addresses in Damacre Road, as the Brechin Community Council reported that said businesses had not received the initial document. The comments from two of the businesses (City Royal Bar and Tayside Cycles) are contained in **Appendix 4.** The third business, Brechin Decorators is no longer trading. City Royal Bar were did not record whether it agreed or disagreed with the proposal in its response.
- 3.6 A response was received from Brechin Community Council expressing their disagreement with the proposals to introduce a one-way system on Damacre Road.

4. PROPOSALS

4.1 Given that 62.5% of returned consultation forms are not in favour of the introduction of a one-way system in Damacre Road, it is recommended that the proposal to introduce a one-way system in Damacre Road does not proceed.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 There are no further financial implications other than the costs associated with the Consultation exercise which can be contained within the Roads Revenue budget for 2018/19.

6. CONSULTATION

6.1 The Chief Executive, Strategic Director - Place, the Head of Finance and Legal and the Local Police commander of Tayside Division were consulted in the preparation of this report.





	AGREE &	DISAGREE	We are business owners + residents of Damacre Road, We have mixed opinion regarding a one way system. We agree there is poor vision exiting Damacre Road onto Southesk Street making it unsafe at times. However if all vehicles are now going to be exiting Damacre Road + City Road via the junction at the bottom of High Street we feel it could cause a lot of congestion. A lot of elderly people live at Southport residential home which is located very close to this junction we feel the additional traffic could be a danger to them. As we own the City Royal bar located on the corner of Damacre Road + City Road we have a number of HGV deliveries per week. The majority of these deliveries come along Damacre Road from Southesk Street however they then turn around and exit the same way as the junction onto the High Street can prove difficult for the size of the vehicles. If a one way system was to be introduced along Damacre Road we feel some of the double yellow lines could be removed. Could the installation of traffic lights help? As both junctions have blind spots. HGV delivery driver's response "Easier to exit at Caledonian Hotel wider junction plus the sally army road is narrow HGV's need the whole junction"	
		DISAGREE	To operate a one way system as illustrated, consideration to the effect that this would have on union street which currently is more of in need to be one way. This proposal would double or even treble the traffic on Union street which currently has parking on left all day and night. Also traffic from city road which has a one way section would have no alternative but to also use Union street causing even further congestion.

		DISAGREE	Although one serious accident occurred recently at the Southesk St Junction the City Road / High St Junction has equally poor visibility. Making this road one way will just increase the volume of traffic at this junction and create the problem at the other end of the street and increase traffic on the High Street and Union Street, both of which have also had serious accidents in the recent past (car hit flats on Union St approx. 2 years ago and a car hit the New Diamond take away on the High St. approx. 8 years ago). Also, the bend at the bottom of City Road isn't wide enough for 2 cars to pass without mounting the pavement - the introduction of additional HGV traffic during the construction of the Damacre Centre Social Housing project is likely to cause a danger on this bend. As someone who pulls out of the Southesk Street and High Street junctions regularly I feel that the Southesk St issue could be resolved by extending the double yellow lines currently outside the Caledonian Hotel further down Southesk Street increasing the visibility splay. I would fully support a 20mph zone or other traffic calming measures on the street however.

	DISAGREE	The junction of Damacre Rd with City Road, and then the junction at the bottom of High St/Union St., creates two difficult exits. There will be increased activity if the one way system goes ahead exacerbated by any proposals arising from the Flicks site. Also need to take into account parking changes due from 1 Nov. Increased signage required to ensure traffic from High St will further aggravate the partial one way system at the top of City Road where I have seen traffic ignoring, or not knowing, emerging on to Swan St. Concerns about traffic arose due to Council proposals for the old Damacre Centre, and I would suggest that these should be addressed first rather than adding to the problem. A realignment of the Wilson's Park junction with Damacre Rd should be considered with the widening of the pavement, and using the existing entrance/exit of the old Centre. It would mean a different layout for housing, but should not reduce the capacity of the site. With a Public House at the City Rd junction, and a Car Park opposite, there is a conflict with pedestrians, as is the case at Southesk St to a lesser extent. Loading and unloading for both premises should also be considered with again the City Road one causing a further blind exit.

Union St is very congested, the proposal of one way would potentially push more traffic on to Union St causing a bigger problem. High St is also congested. Leave Damacre Road as it is.
