POLICY FOR THE LEASE OF COUNCIL LAND AND BUILDINGS TO COMMUNITY/VOLUNTARY GROUPS – CLOTHES BANKS

REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF INFRASTRUCTURE

ABSTRACT

This report advises the Committee of the current practice of leasing land and buildings to Community/Voluntary Groups and recommends expansion of the policy to include clothes banks.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

1.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve the expansion of the policy for the lease of Council land and buildings to Community/Voluntary Groups to include clothes banks at £1 per annum.

3. CURRENT POSITION

- 3.1 The Council's policy for the lease of Council land and buildings to Community/Voluntary Groups is set out in Report 409/13 Policy for the Lease of Council Land and Buildings to Community/Voluntary Groups, presented to Strategic Policy Committee on 25 July 2013.
- 3.2 As part of that policy it was noted:

"Angus Council wishes to assist organisations which provide Community Benefit to Angus through a discounted rent scheme for those Community / Voluntary / Charity Groups wishing to lease Council land and buildings.

Such groups should endeavour to contribute to the delivery of the Angus Community Plan and Single Outcome Agreement." And

And "The level of discount to be applied will vary dependent on the type of organisation...."

3.3. The discount for Foodbanks was rent of £1 per annum.

4. PROPOSALS

- 4.1 At the time of original policy in 2013, clothes banks were not foreseen, but are now emerging in parts of the County, allowing access to clothing items for people in need.
- 4.2 It is proposed that clothes banks are granted the same property rental, of £1 per annum, as Foodbanks when Community/Voluntary/Charity Groups wish to lease Council land and buildings.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 Implementation of the proposals in this report will result in a small reduction in income to the Council where the discount is applied, however the proposals will provide support to Community/Voluntary/Charity Groups to assist in the delivery of the council's local outcomes.
