ACTIONS TAKEN IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF INFRASTRUCTURE

ABSTRACT

This report seeks ratification of the actions taken by the Director of Infrastructure in response to the COVID-19 pandemic as reported to this Committee on 28 April and detailed in paragraph 3.1 hereto and seeks approval to extend some of these emergency delegated powers. It also advises the Committee on further action taken by the Chief Executive using emergency delegated powers.

1. **RECOMMENDATION(S)**

It is recommended that the Committee: -

- (i) notes and ratifies the actions detailed in paragraph 3.1 taken by the Director of Infrastructure as reported to this Committee on 28 April 2020;
- (ii) notes the further action taken by the Chief Executive in response to the COVID-19 pandemic using delegated powers detailed in Appendix 1;
- (iii) approves the extension to officer delegation for the Director of Infrastructure as detailed in paragraphs 3.2 until such time as the Council agrees otherwise; and
- (iv) notes that until such time as the Council agrees otherwise, the Scheme of Delegation to Officers will be amended to reflect any changes agreed in terms of this report.

2. ALIGNMENT TO THE ANGUS LOCAL OUTCOMES IMPROVEMENT PLAN/CORPORATE PLAN

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Special Council on 3 April 2020 approved recommendations to give additional delegated powers to the Chief Executive and Directors in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. Report No 132/20 to this Committee on 28 April 2020 provided details of actions approved by the Chief Executive and Directors using these emergency delegated powers. A number of actions undertaken by the Director of Infrastructure were reported detailing use of emergency powers that could only be exercised in the event of an emergency and where it was not possible for whatever reason to convene the relevant committee to make the decision. These decisions were in relation to: -
 - 1. Arbroath Common Good Fund;
 - 2. Montrose Common Good Fund;
 - 3. Disposal of Property No 1 (Exempt Appendix)
 - 4. Disposal of Property No 2 (Exempt Appendix)

Committee approval is therefore now sought to ratify these decisions.

- 3.2 It has become apparent that these emergency Delegated Powers are required by the Director of Infrastructure now and approval of this is sought, namely:
 - *i.* To expend Common Good Funds as urgently required subject to agreement by the majority of all local ward members for the Common Good (without the requirements to report to Policy & Resources Committee);.
 - *ii.* Where urgently required the authority to expend general fund budget to sustain current council contractors/suppliers/service provider property related services, after consultation with the Director of Finance; and
 - iii. Or in his absence, the Service Leader Assets, where essential, the authority to sell or lease of property previously declared surplus up to a value of £250,000 following consultation with the Convener and Vice Convener of Communities and leader of the Non-Administration

4. CURRENT POSITION

Since 28 April, the further action detailed in **Appendix 1** has been taken by the Chief Executive using emergency delegated powers and, as required, this is now reported to committee for noting.

5. PROPOSAL

It is proposed that Committee ratifies the actions taken by the Director of Infrastructure as previously reported to this Committee on 28 April 2020. Committee is also asked to approve the extension to officer delegation for the Director of Infrastructure as detailed in paragraph 3.2 of this Report until such time as the Council agrees otherwise.

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Financial implications of the actions that Committee is being asked to ratify were detailed, where applicable, in Report No on 28 April 2020. Financial implications of the new action being reported to Committee are detailed in Appendix 1.
