REVIEW OF INTEGRATION SCHEME
REPORT BY GAIL SMITH, INTERIM CHIEF OFFICER

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this report is to advise the Board of the commencement of the review of the Integration Scheme between NHS Tayside and Angus Council and seeks comments on the review of the Integration Scheme.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Integration Joint Board:-

- (i) notes the commencement of the review of the Integration Scheme between NHS Tayside and Angus Council,
- (ii) provides comment on the review of the Integration Scheme; and
- (iii) notes that comments can be emailed by Board members to the Interim Chief Officer.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The Board, at its meeting on 22 April 2020, consider report No. 16/20, in respect of the review of the Integration Scheme between Angus Council and NHS Tayside. Having considered that report, the Board agreed to note:-

- (i) the requirements imposed by the Public Bodies (Joint Working)(Scotland) Act 2014 on local authorities and Health Boards in relation to the review of integration schemes; and
- (ii) the terms of the correspondence received from the Scottish Government.

2.3 The review of the Integration Scheme between Angus Council and NHS Tayside has commenced taking into account the terms of the correspondence received from the Scottish Government.

2.4 The Board is invited to comment on the review of the Integration Scheme. The Board may wish to consider:-

- (i) how well the Integration Scheme promotes the integration of health and social care in Angus,
- (ii) whether there are parts of the Integration Scheme that should be changed,
- (iii) whether there are matters that should be included in the integration scheme which currently are not.

2.5 Once the review has concluded, the results of the review and the consultation responses will be acknowledged jointly and formally by NHS Tayside and Angus Council. In addition, the review

will note anything that requires further work between the Council and NHS Tayside and set out plans for the completion of that work at a later date.

2.6 Board members are asked to note that comments on the Integration Scheme can be emailed directly to the Interim Chief Officer.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications arising directly from this report.

4. DIRECTIONS

The Integration Joint Board requires a mechanism to action its strategic commissioning plans and this is provided for in Section 26 to 28 of the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014.
