ABSTRACT

The purpose of this report is to provide assurance to the Angus Integration Board (IJB) that there are effective and embedded systems for Clinical Care and Professional Governance in all services within Angus Health and Social Care Partnership. The report summarises work undertaken by the Clinical Care and Professional Governance Forum throughout 2019/20.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The Internal Audit report AN05/18 "Clinical, Care and Professional Governance" recommended that the local Clinical, Care and Professional Governance Forum submit an Annual Assurance Report to the Integration Joint Board Audit Committee or Integration Joint Board itself. It had been agreed this report will be submitted to the Integration Joint Board Audit Committee.
- 2.2 The 2019/20 report was signed off by the Angus Clinical, Care and Professional Governance Forum at the meeting on 08 June 2020.
- 2.3 The Annual Assurance Report Clinical, Care and Professional Governance Forum 2019/20 was submitted to the Integration Joint Board Audit Committee on 24 June 2020.

3. CURRENT POSITION

- 3.1 The Angus CCPG continues to meet bi-monthly and has resumed normal activity following cancellation of the April meeting due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The provision of this report has therefore been delayed. The group is now taking steps to ensure all normal activities are resumed.
