## THE ANGUS COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING) (ON-STREET PARKING) (DECRIMINALISED ENFORCEMENT) (No. 4) ORDER 2020

On 31 August 2020 Angus Council made The Angus Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Loading) (On-Street Parking) (Decriminalised Enforcement) (No. 4) Order 2020. The order comes into operation on 14 September 2020.

A notice of the proposals under the order was advertised in the Dundee Courier and Advertiser on 6 December 2019 and the effect of the order is as advertised in that notice, except for the proposals at (1) Thistle Street, Carnoustie in relation to which the council has deferred its decision on whether to bring them into effect, and (2) Panter Crescent, Montrose in relation to which the council has reduced the extent of its proposals to provide protection to the south side of the road junction at Renny Crescent only.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that a requirement of that Act or of any relevant regulations made under it has not been complied with may, within six weeks from 31 August 2020, make application to the Court of Session for this purpose.
