- 1. This is a supplement to the provision for carriageway / footway reconstruction within Infrastructure Services.
- 2. This is a supplement to the provision for road safety measures within Infrastructure Services.
- 3. The Council declared a Climate Emergency some time ago. This provision will provide funding to support carbon reduction initiatives which can be deployed as projects are developed by officers. For exampe, there are currently Photovoltaic schemes scoped for a number of large council buildings that could be progressed and would reduce the Council's carbon emissions.
- 4. To assist community resilience in Rural Angus. This will allow the acquisition of circa 25 snow ploughs for tractors for use by farmers to keep roads in their areas clear in winter conditions.
- 5. This project will examine the feasibility of relocating a joint full services re-cycling centre to serve both Carnoustie and Monifieth that prevents the need for residents to travel to Arbroath to use full suite of recycling services. Should no project ultimately be taken forward it is noted that the feasibility study would require to be funded from revenue funds.
- 6. This is funding provision for the currently unfunded element of the project in recognition that the Council is now committed to this expenditure.
- 7. The capital contingency is currently £4.473m.
