LICENSING OF SEX SHOPS

REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR OF LEGAL AND DEMOCRATIC SERVICES

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this report is to note that the sex shop licensing regime will come into effect in August 2021 and to approve appropriate fees and forms relating to applications.

1. RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee: -

- note that Angus Council made the Resolution contained within Appendix 1 on 12
 August 2020 and that prior notice of this Resolution was given and circulated in the Courier newspaper 28 days with no representations being received;
- (ii) note that the licensing of sex shops will come into effect from 12 August 2021;
- (iii) note that applications for sex shop licences will be processed in accordance with the provisions of Schedule 2 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982;
- (iv) determine that the fees relating to applications for a sex shop licence be charged in accordance with those set out in **Appendix 2**;
- (v) determine that applications for licences should be made in accordance with the application forms contained within **Appendix 4.**

2. REPORT

- 2.1 Section 45 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 contains provisions which allow local authorities to issue licences in respect of business operating as sex shops. This Committee determined at its meeting on 31 October 2019 to recommend to Angus Council to make a resolution requiring such businesses to obtain this licence. A link to report 360/19 is contained here.
- 2.2 Notice of the proposed Resolution was circulated in the Courier newspaper for a period of at least 28 days prior to Angus Council making a determination in respect of the Resolution. No representations were received. Accordingly, Angus Council determined to make the Resolution. In terms of the legislation, such a Resolution cannot come into effect until at least 9 months after it being made. In this instance, the Council determined that the Resolution should come into effect after 12 months to coincide with the licensing of Sexual Entertainment Venues being introduced.
- 2.3 Prior to the licensing system coming into effect, the Committee is being asked to approve and set the fees for applications relating to sex shop licence applications. A proposed fee table for consideration has been provided at **Appendix 2**.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications arising directly from this Report. In terms of the fee set, in terms of the legislation, this should be set at a level where the authority can recover its cost. The proposed fee is in line with applications for less complex Public Entertainment Licences

and is considered to be equal in terms of amount of work required. This fee should be kept under review as with other Civic Licensing fees to ensure that the fee charged is appropriate.

4. HUMAN RIGHTS IMPLICATIONS

There are no human rights issues arising directly from this Report.

5. **EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS**

An Equalities Impact Assessment was completed at the time of the Council making a resolution and has been contained at **Appendix 3** for information. The Committee's decision in relation to this report does not affect the Assessment made previously and no update is required.
