EAST MUIRHEAD OF LOGIE FARM, KIRRIEMUIR

REPORT BY THE HEAD OF REGULATORY & PROTECTIVE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

This report deals with an application to grant a caravan site licence at East Muirhead of Logie Farm, Kirriemuir in order to allow the use of the site for the purposes of a caravan site.

1. RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Committee agree:
 - (I) to grant a caravan site licence to Graham Galloway, 62 Glamis Road , Kirriemuir, DD8 5DD subject to the site's compliance with the "Model Standards" for caravan sites,
 - (ii) agree that the maximum number of caravans to be stationed on site at any one time be 12, and,
 - (iii) agree that the operating period be 28th April 1st May 2017.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Angus Council recently received an application for a caravan site licence in terms of the Caravan Sites and Control of Development Act 1960 from Mr Graham Galloway, 62 Glamis Road, Kirriemuir, DD8 5DD. The site is located at East Muirhead of Logie Farm by Kirriemuir. Confirmation has been received from the Planning Division that planning permission is not required in this instance as the site is incidental to the principal use of the site for a music festival.
- 3.2 The site operates with the benefit of appropriate planning permission and it is confirmed that the above amendments would not result in any breach of the current planning consent.
- 3.3 It is intended that the land to which this application relates will be used between the dates specified to allow the owners of caravans attending the Bonfest Music Festival to site their caravans. Once the festival ends the land will be returned to its previous use.

4. DETERMINATION OF LICENCE

4.1 The applicant has been requested to consult with the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service with a view to ensuring that an adequate fire risk assessment will be carried out prior to opening.

4.2 The proposed site has been inspected by Environmental Health staff and no safety or sanitation issues have been identified. Regard has been had to the "Model Standards" for caravan sites in drafting the site licence conditions.
