THRUMS CARAVAN SITE, MARYTON, KIRRIEMUIR

REPORT BY THE HEAD OF REGULATORY & PROTECTIVE SERVICES

ABSTRACT

To approve the transfer of Thrums Caravan Site licence.

1. RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Committee agree:
 - (i) to approve the transfer of the caravan site licence for Thrums Caravan Park, Maryton, by Kirriemuir to M B Developments, The Hoose, Kinloch, Blairgowrie.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Angus Council recently received an application for a transfer of the licence for Thrums Caravan Site, Maryton, by Kirriemuir previously held by Crown Parks Estates.
- 3.2 This is a residential caravan site with a licence for 16 residential pitches operating all year round. There are no changes currently proposed to the site operating times or number of caravans.
- 3.3 An officer has recently visited the site and has advised that the applicants will be utilising the existing site infrastructure and are currently carrying out upgrading works to parts of the site. This service has provided detailed information directly to the applicants regarding the relevant model standards and a further inspection will be undertaken once the site is occupied.

4. DETERMINATION OF LICENCE

4.1 On the basis that the necessary planning consents are in place, a transfer of the licence must be approved.
