Street Trader's Licence

This form relates to applications for street trader's licences where the activity involves frequent movement between locations e.g. grocery vehicles, power washing services etc. If you intend to operate from the same location for any period exceeding 30 minutes you should obtain and complete the "Street Trader's Licence - Fixed Pitch" form available from the Licensing Section.

The application form should be completed and returned to the Service Leader – Legal & Democratic, Angus Council, Angus House, Sylvie Way, Orchardbank Business Park, Forfar, DD8 1AN.

The lodging fee of £176 for a new grant or the lodging fee of £146 for a renewal should be submitted with the application form and please note that this fee is not refundable.

Cheques should be made payable to Angus Council.

In order that your badge type licence may be prepared, you should forward three recent photographs of yourself which must be taken full face and without a hat. The photographs should be standard passport size. They should be printed on normal photographic paper and be unmounted.

In order to verify the likeness of the photographs to yourself, there must be written on the back of one of the photographs by a countersignatory "I certify that this is a true likeness of [title and full name of applicant] accompanied by the date, the countersignatory's signature and the countersignatory's name and designation in block capitals. Your countersignatory must work in (or be retired from) a recognised profession and/or be a "person of good standing in their community". Your countersignatory cannot be closely-related to or be involved with you, for example, related by birth or marriage or be in a relationship with/live at the same address as you. Examples of recognised professions can be found on the GOV.UK website.

On receipt of your application form a copy of the form will be forwarded to Police Scotland in order that they may carry out checks into your suitability to hold a licence and this will include a check on any convictions/offences. The Council will also consult with the Revenues and Benefits Service to check whether you have any outstanding debts due to the Council and the Regulatory, Protective & Prevention Service. If you are applying for a licence for power washing services e.g. wheelie bin cleaning, Scottish Water will also be consulted. This process will take a statutory minimum period of four weeks.

Should there be any comments on your application, this will require to be considered by the next available Civic Licensing Committee which generally meets on a six weekly cycle.
