

# ANGUS LICENSING BOARD

MINUTE of SPECIAL MEETING of the **ANGUS LICENSING BOARD** held remotely on Thursday 5 August 2021 at 2.00pm.

**Present:** Councillors CRAIG FOTHERINGHAM, RICHARD MOORE, BRENDA DURNO, DAVID FAIRWEATHER, ALEX KING, DAVID LUMGAIR and BETH WHITESIDE

Councillor FOTHERINGHAM, Convener, in the Chair.

Prior to the commencement of business, the Convener intimated that this was the last Licensing Board for Nannette Page, Senior Solicitor. The Convener and a number of members thanked her for her tremendous support and advice received over the many years and wished her well for the future.

## 1. APOLOGIES

There were no apologies for absence intimated.

## 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest made.

## 3. THE AIG WOMEN'S OPEN 2021, LINKS PARADE, CARNOUSTIE

There was submitted Report No LB 31/21 by the Clerk on an application received for an occasional licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, which required to be determined by the Board as detailed in the Appendix to the Report.

The Clerk advised that there was a minor amendment to Section 1 of the Report and requested that the wording "one of" be removed. She also drew members attention to Recommendation 1.3 of the Report and the associated background details as outlined in Section 3.6 of the Report

The Board considered an application from Elizabeth Mallinson, Personal Licence Holder, requesting an Occasional Licence from Saturday 14 August 2021 to Monday 23 August 2021 in respect of the AIG Women's Open 2021, Links Parade, Carnoustie.

Elizabeth Mallinson, applicant, also Colin Edgar, The R&A, addressed the Board.

The Board agreed: -

- (i) that the application be granted subject to the Mandatory Conditions and the following additional conditions as referred to in Section 4 of the Appendix to the Licensing Standards Officer's Report: -
  - a. Licensed area defined as per Layout Plan titled "AIGWO Site Layout".
  - b. Stewarding to be provided to the satisfaction of Police Scotland;
  - c. Emergency vehicle access to be maintained to the satisfaction of Scottish Fire and Rescue Service;
  - d. No children will be permitted in any facility selling alcohol beyond 9pm;
  - e. A complete list of all Personal Licence Holders working at the event shall be provided to the Clerk to the Licensing Board and Police Scotland at least 7 days prior to the event;
  - f. The licence holder shall comply with any order or instruction given by any Police Officers in connection with any emergency or disturbance (including an order or instruction to close the premises or part thereof for a limited period) or any occasion when such Police Officer in his or her discretion may consider it necessary, having regard to the licensing objectives, to give that order or instruction;
  - g. The licence holder must ensure that there are procedures in place to ensure no spectators leave the venue in possession of open containers of alcohol in accordance with the Angus Byelaws in place in relation Prohibition of Consumption of Alcohol in a Public Place; and
  - h. It is the licence holder's responsibility to ensure they are up to date in respect of all COVID guidelines throughout the duration of this occasional licence. To protect and improve public health the licence will only be operated in accordance with, legislation,

regulations and directions of the UK and Scottish Governments relative to the COVID-19 pandemic in respect of Gateway Events; and

- (ii) to delegate authority to the Clerk to agree variations to the licence, (including the Alcohol Management Plan) as set out in paragraph 3.6 of the Report to ensure the effective and efficient operation of the event; and
  - (a) that in terms of the local condition D(ii) (Standard to Occasional Licences) that this be disapplied to this event.
