to funding for Play park equipment Cllr Bell suggested approaching NHS Community Innovation Fund. J.Johnston agreed to email R.McIntosh with a request for funding of £9,500 for play equipment emphasising rural isolation and physical and mental health.

A suggestion was raised with regards to the possibility of holding a car boot sale to raise some funds. Cllr Bell offered to look into the possibility of using the public car park for such an event. R.Finlay agreed to speak to W.Inglis with regards to using the car park of the Strathmore Arms for parking.
