Proposal to extend footpath at the end of existing road

I write in connection with the above planning application.

Noted on the CC3 was the civil engineers, Fairhurst. I contacted fairhurst about these plans who said it was actually for agricultural access, not a footpath. A public foot path would be a great amenity to have however it is not for this purpose so I therefore strongly object to these plans and my reasons are as follows: Firstly, I know the road down to the planned area of change is very unsustainable for agricultural purposes, it narrows down and parts and is already partially worn away which leads me to believe that agricultural vehicles will further damage the road and lead to large pot holes which is not fair on the already existing community.

Secondly, Fairhurst civil engineers also added that they could not comment whether this access would not lead to further development of houses or other communities in the future. We moved into this house on the 1st of October and we bought this property (paying a large fee more) simply for the tranquility and peace that the property currently offers. Not only will the current plans of adding agricultural access lead to passing traffic and noise but the possibility of housing/developments being added on will lead to increasing disruption. We moved away from city centre to have no passing by traffic so we are utterly heartbroken at the fact that this could shortly be changed.

Thirdly, the planned access would remove the ability for turning space for all current residents and would reduce the ability to have any over flow parking for any residents, with the street being already narrow as it is and this would reduce the already narrow street.

Lastly, the noise and disturbance from any of these possible plans would severely affect our home life and mental health, we moved here for a fresh start and a peaceful lifestyle.
