The aim of the proposal is to support meeting budget savings targets by reducing the revenue budget allocated to the Children, Families and Justice Directorate for the provision of community childminding. Previously, the service accessed childminding facilities for families in need, however since the expansion of early learning and child care as a universal entitlement, the need for this as a separate service has reduced. As a result, demand for this service and the amount of provision has decreased and this proposal reflects that change in pattern of usage.
