

MINUTES OF FERRYDEN AND CRAIG COMMUNITY COUNCIL

HELD ON 1 FEBRUARY 2022

Welcome to meeting. Chairman Gordon welcomed everyone to the first proper meeting since March 2020		
In Memorium A minutes silence was held in respect of the community councillors Janet Livingston and Jeanette Lawes, former community councillor Tom Easton and all those that have been lost to the community since our last official meeting		
Police Report Sgt Peter Mustard, of the local Community Policing Team delivered a full report, a copy of which will be sent out with the minutes.		
55 crimes reported in Montrose area in January, split into 6 categories. Distraction theft is becoming prevalent and asked everyone to take care to avoid becoming a victim.		
Youth disorder and anti social behaviour is most relevant and asks us to phone in to allow police to sort out. Drugs does not appear to be an issue in Ferryden but if we are aware of any instances please contact as soon as possible		
Speeding – 20mph limits but are difficult to enforce and council was advised from outset that only around schools could they be actively monitored., but will look at other areas where either resources or need demands further action. Cllr Salmond expressed disappointment that not being supported by the police in their efforts to reduce speed. Sgt Mustard advised circumstances dictated they would look speed safety campaigns.		
Issue of William Street and King Street raised, Sgt Mustard acknowledged issue and was aware of this but case of catching them in the process of committing the crime. Need us to phone in preferably with registration numbers. Residents raised various issues that had been encountered. Will highlight that there is an ongoing issue to the relevant level to allow action to be taken place.	ALL	

Cllr Stewart raised issue of difficulty of getting through, and feeling is no action is taken on reports. Appreciate that this depends on the control room as to what gets passed through. Sgt Mustard explained system in the control room and sympathises with issue but is very much outwith the local influence.

Gordon advised that it was great we were able to meet after being in abeyance for the last 2 years. Whilst we did have requests from the public for meetings at various points, we were not allowed to meet at these times, but community councillors did work on issues raised.
