## 4. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTE / UPDATE

# 5. **RESILIENCE UPDATE**

JS provided an update: Covid - current vaccination, testing and infection rates. MA provided an update on the national picture and as Chair of the Concurrent Risks Oversight Group. There was also an update on the response to recent storms. Work continues on recovery across all partners aligned to the ongoing response to Covid, and economic and societal recovery within our communities.

# 6. TRAUMA INFORMED PRACTICE IN ANGUS

SF provided update. Being trauma informed is essential across all services. We all have a duty to ensure we minimise re-traumatisation during the provision of our services. The Scottish Government has an ambition to create a trauma informed and trauma responsive workforce across Scotland, ensuring that services and care are delivered in ways which prevent re-traumatisation of children, young people and adults who have been affected by psychological trauma or adversity at any stage in their lives.

There have been pockets of work undertaken across Angus to upskill the workforce around TIP and to embed a trauma informed approach to practice, which has had positive results.

This work includes developing the knowledge and skills of the workforce on working in a trauma informed way whilst also creating capacity within Angus to provide development up to level 3 on the National Trauma Training Framework. TIP will be made available to the whole Angus workforce. Deepening the understanding and impact of trauma across the workforce will ensure that people take a trauma informed approached to the development and delivery of all services – not just those which have direct contact with people who have a more obvious experience of trauma. A working group of partner organisations in Angus has been set up to support embedding the National Trauma Training Programme in a co-ordinated way across the workforce in Angus whatever organisation they are in. The aims of the group are

Our overarching vision is to develop a trauma informed and responsive workforce, that:

- is informed by people with lived experience
- recognises the importance of wellbeing in the workforce
- recognises where people are affected by trauma and adversity
- responds in ways that prevent further harm
- supports recovery
- and can address inequalities and improve life chances

# 7. SERVICE DESIGN UPDATE

MA gave an update on the Service Design projects underway in Angus Council. Service design is a process where designers create sustainable solutions and optimal experiences for both customers in unique contexts and any service providers involved. Designers break services into sections and adapt fine-tuned solutions to suit all users' needs based on partners, location and other factors. The pilots underway in Angus focus on improving engagement with local people to ensure all services are making the required impact.

The projects are at the mapping and solutions stage and more information will be presented at the CPP in July.

At this stage in the meeting, the meeting was adjourned for a 5 minute comfort break.

# 8. NATIONAL PLANNING FRAMEWORK 4

NH gave a very informative and detailed presentation on the National Planning Framework 4 and the implications for angus. NPF4 will, when adopted, set out the Scottish Governments priorities and policies for the planning system up to 2045 and how our approach to planning and development will help to achieve a net zero, sustainable Scotland by 2045. NPF4 differs from previous NPFs in two ways. It incorporates Scottish Planning Policy and the NPF into a single document and will form a part of the statutory development plan.

# 9. COMMUNITY PLAN REFRESH UPDATE

PM gave an update on the work done to date to help review and redraft the Angus Community Plan. He advised there had been 3 workshops to date focusing on the vision, priorities, outcomes and outputs. The timeline was presented and at the next meeting a skeleton of the plan will be tabled for partners input.

# 10. PARTNER UPDATES: OPPORTUNITIES TO SHARE 2022 ACTIVITY

HM provided an update on the Consultation, Action and Transformation research project. Angus Women's Aid, Deaf Links, Relationship Scotland FM and Children's Health Scotland have joined together to look at what can be learned from the COVID-19 response to help improve the design and delivery of services across Angus.

A number of online and face to face focus groups were held in December followed by online and paper surveys issued earlier this month. This will be followed with a number of feedback sessions to let people know what the findings have been and an opportunity to provide feedback on the suggestions and provide input on how these might be addressed.
