ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

ANGUS COUNCIL (WEIGHT LIMITS ON ROADS) ORDER 2003

Angus Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and 32 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "Angus Council (Weight Limits on Roads) Order 2003" and shall come into operation on the Twenty sixth day of September Two thousand and three.
2. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle or vehicle and load upon any length of road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order if the weight of the vehicle and load combined exceeds the weight specified in Column 2 of the Schedule opposite to the description of the said length of road.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing or permitting any vehicle in excess of the permitted weight to proceed in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order if the vehicle is being used:-
 - (a) for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated in or adjacent to the said lengths of road,
 - (b) school buses being used for the purpose of carrying persons to and from a school.
 - (c) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the said lengths of road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in the said lengths of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the said lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus.
 - (d) for the purpose of agriculture in connection with land adjacent to the said lengths of road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon the land.
 - (e) any other vehicle being used by Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance emergency purposes or a motor vehicle in the service of a Local Authority being used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties.
4. The Tayside Region (Weight and Width Limits on Roads) (Consolidation) Order 1987 insofar as it relates to any road in the Angus area is hereby revoked.


