ANGUS IJB DIRECTIONS UPDATE
REPORT BY GAIL SMITH, CHIEF OFFICER

ABSTRACT

This report outlines a summary of the Directions issued by the IJB from January 2022 to November 2022 (inclusive).

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Integration Joint Board (IJB) Audit Committee: -

- (i) Review the details of the Directions issued by Angus HSCP from January 2022.
- (ii) Requests a further update be prepared to the IJB Audit Committee in June 2023

2. BACKGROUND

Issuing of Directions is the method through which the IJB commissions Angus Council and NHS Tayside to deliver the priorities outlined within the IJB's Strategic Plan. Directions are legally binding, and the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 and associated secondary legislation establishes the framework within which they operate.

On 24 August 2022 IJB members approved the Angus IJB Directions Policy and Procedure as outlined in Appendix 1 to IJB report 51/22.

The policy outlines that the IJB's Audit Committee will assume responsibility for overview of progress with the implementation of directions, requesting a twice-yearly progress report, and escalating key delivery issues to the IJB (June and December).

This report outlines a summary of the Directions issued by the IJB in 2022 and their status. The report does not provide detail of the Directions' content or commentary on their impacts, as it is considered that this level of oversight is facilitated through the normal management arrangements of the IJB and Angus Health and Social Care Partnership.

3. CURRENT POSITION

In Appendix 1, the current position or status of each Direction is listed under a "status" column. The IJB will develop a series of indicators to consistently describe the current status. Initially the following will be used:-

- Not started (Could apply to recently issued Directions)
- Work in Progress (Where the implementation of a Direction is underway but not yet complete).
- Complete (Where all directed actions are complete).
- Archived (Directions will be noted as archived after they have appeared in 2 half yearly updates as complete).

Between January and November 2022 (inclusive) the IJB issued 5 Directions to NHS Tayside and none to Angus Council

Of the 5 Directions issued by the IJB

- Two have not started
- Three remain work in progress

While some Directions are not yet started, none require further interventions.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The financial implications associated with all issued Directions are set out in the original IJB reports and detailed in Appendix 1.

5. RISK

Failure to comply with the legislative requirement and framework for Directions would place the IJB in breach of its statutory duties.

6. EQUALITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

An Equality Impact Assessment is not required.
