Thanks to everyone involved in helping with maintenance of this. 2. <u>Active Travel</u> – there will a meeting held in the New Year re. this fund. 3. <u>Parking in South Street</u> – this is still under consultation. 4. <u>Participatory Budget</u> – we are still waiting to find out if J Berg has contacted Angus Council to reassign the money from Sustainability Newtyle. 5. <u>Community Survey</u> – we feel this is not feasible now due to expected timescales. 6. <u>Hall Resilience</u> – there is to be a Cost of Living Roadshow in Forfar tomorrow. 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<p>9. <u>Council Communications</u> – there is a new communication engagement and consultation strategy being developed. Communication was discussed at the Bi-Annual meeting and Lynn Hally said to contact her if we had any issues.</p> <p>10. <u>Speeding in the village</u> – data has been requested.</p> <p>11. <u>Housing Development – Glamis Road</u> – we decided as a Community Council we would not object. We shared the link to ensure everyone was aware of the forthcoming planned development and give them the opportunity to comment on the planning portal.</p> <p>12. <u>GDPR Policy</u> – We now have a GDPR policy in place and all Community Council members and Resilience volunteers have a signed agreement. P Small is our dedicated Data Protection Officer.</p> <p>From resilience notes:- C Matthews has taken on the role on temporary basis and has asked H McFarlane to assist her, which she agreed to do. Christine is hoping to have a meeting with everyone on the Resilience Team to set out responsibilities etc. She discussed her ideas for effective co-ordination between key personnel, she has also filled in an application form for funding for various projects in connection with resilience and the hall.</p>	Cllr Bell
