### 2) MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS AND MATTERS ARISING

The minutes of Meeting 18.1.23 were accepted as a true record. Given that some people in attendance were only there to discuss particular issues we agreed that we would discuss Lownie Solar Farm first, followed by the report from the school and then we would work through the rest of the agenda items.

#### 3) Lownie Solar Farm

Concerns were raised by members of the community over the Lownie Solar Farm development and advice was sought on how the planning process would work and what options members of the community have if they wish to object. The proposed solar farm sits within the boundary of both Forfar and Inverarity Community Councils.

Individuals wishing to object can write to the Council individually. Councillor Bell reassured those at the meeting that although the website asks for comments by email, letters written by hand and posted to the Council would also be received. The size of the development means that the final decision on planning would be taken by the Scottish Government, but Angus Council would be involved in the early stages and would be discussing it at Council Meetings. If letters are written to Angus Council it is helpful if they cross reference the Local Development Plans. Members of the public are permitted to apply to form a deputation at Council Meetings.

### 4) School Report

A report from Inverarity Primary School was given by Jane Turrent. Numbers registering for the School are looking good for the next academic year, and the nursery is now full, with 16 children registered. Breakfast Club has been successful, and its future will be discussed with parents around Eastertime. There will be a show in the last week of the school summer term, entitled "The Greatest Show" and the school would like to invite the Community to attend. The Parent Council would like to invite everyone to a car boot sale in the school carpark on Saturday 22 April 2023. The school grounds will be open for playing during the holidays from Tuesday to Saturday.
