AOCB:

SSEN – consultation on East Coast 400kV Phase 2

John Grieve and Lorna Bruce attended a meeting re Tannadice. There appears to have been patchy consultation on this project. Leaflets received in Laurencekirk and Aberlemno Consultation open until 09/06/23

Money raised for defibrillator in Noranside but no suitable site for it with electricity supply. This to be considered with Councillor Bell liaising, possibility of attaching to Council house or the bus shelter.

Michelle Hampshire from Glen Prosen has agreed to become minute secretary and will attend the next meeting.

Ivan Laird then introduced Mr Roger Laird from Scotia Homes who gave his presentation. This showed the site plan, housing types- 16 houses and 6 affordable houses. There is to be renewable energy provision.

Consultation on this project is in the early stages and this is the first public consultation. Concerns were raised by attendees from Tannadice regarding the choice of site. There were questions regarding sewage and waste water and the impact on the entrance to the school. Access to the site was considered problematic because of steepness of verges. Mention was made of the restriction on work during red squirrel breeding season between February and October. There was concern raised about the impact on privacy of existing

gardens, and promised footpath access to school.
